Course Changes Passed by Board

PORTLAND (AP) — The State Board of Higher Education again rebuffed some but not all of Portland State College's attempts to expand its courses Monday.

Chancellor John Richards said the University of Oregon will protest vigorously against establishment of a business administration school at Portland State.

He said the faculty at the university feels it cannot maintain a program of prestige if competition comes both from Oregon State and Portland State.

The fast-growing school gained 43 hours of additional courses, and got an indication from the board's curriculum committee that it would recommend the school be allowed to grant bachelor of arts degrees.

The school now gives bachelor of science degrees. The arts degree will call only for addition of some hours of foreign languages.

The committee also approved granting of masters' degrees in education at Oregon College of Education and Eastern and Southern Oregon colleges.

Several speakers argued that Portland State needs more courses to meet the needs of its increasing student body. Among them were Allen Hart, Portland, newest addition to the board; state Sens. Alfred Corbett and Monroe Sweetland, and Dr. J. F. Cramer, Portland State president.

Portland State's request to add upper class work in business administration drew the heaviest opposition. The college has 550 students enrolled in business administration.
