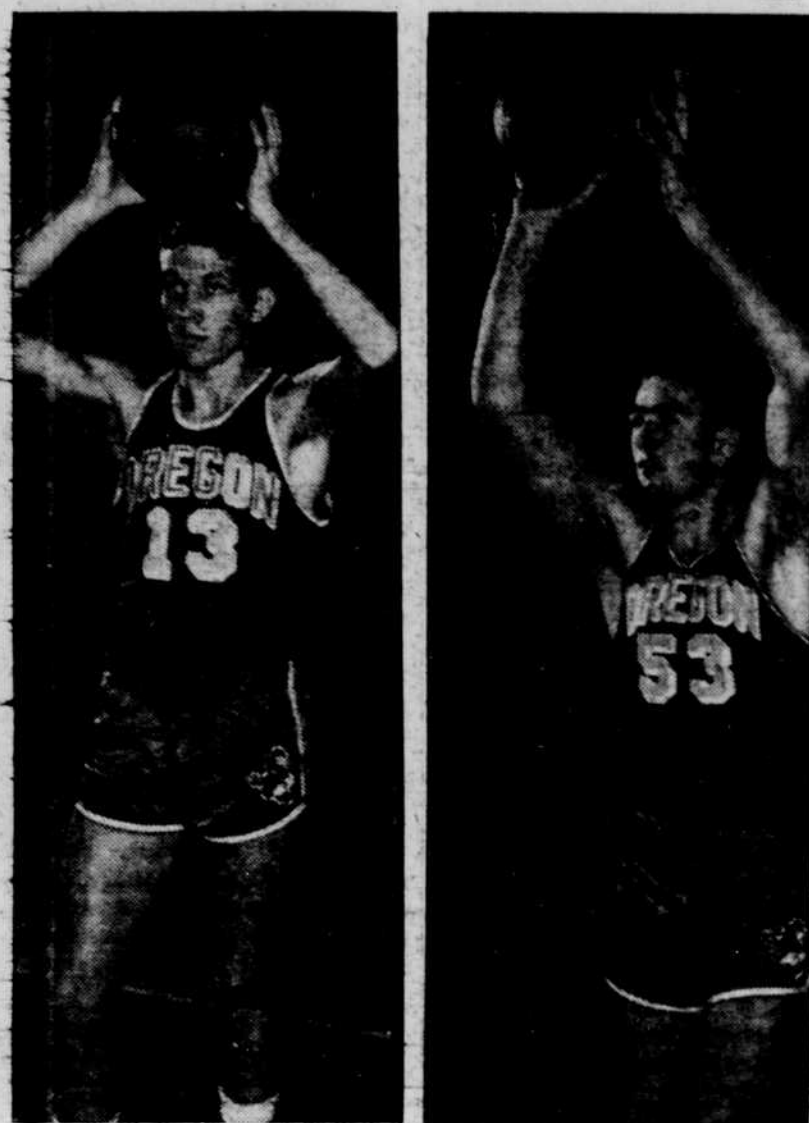


Webfoot Cagers Host OSC Next

Franklin Retains UO Scoring Lead

Oregon's crafty cage star Charlie Franklin increased his team scoring leadership after the Webfoots' first 14 games this season. The 6-3 forward tallied 44 points in Oregon's weekend games against Washington State and Idaho to boost his average to 15.7.

Franklin has scored 229 points on 68 field goals and 84 free throws to lead the Ducks in those two departments also. He also set the all-time University career scoring record against Pacific Coast Conference competition held previously by Roger Wiley.

Franklin now has 608 points in three years as a Webfoot varsity hooper, well above the 565 record Wiley had in the 1947-49 seasons. The Webfoot senior is now only 36 points behind Wiley's four year record of 644 points.

Over-All Mark in Sight

Franklin can also top Bob Hamilton's over-all three-year record of 1073 points if he averages better than 18.3 points per game. His 35 points against Idaho last Saturday was only one point short of his own single-game scoring record set last year against Washington State.

Webfoot guard Chuck Rask leads the squad in shooting accuracy from the field. The ball-hawking sophomore has connected on 57 shots out of 131 tries for a .435 average. Forward Dale Herron is second with a .389 average.

Big 6-6 center Hal Duffy tops the team in rebounds with 161. He's followed by Franklin who has collared 140 balls off the boards. Herron is third with 93.

Franklin Paces Gift Shooting

Franklin also tops the Ducks in free throw accuracy with a .764 average on 84 of 110 successful attempts. Duffy follows with 51 ringers in 70 tries for a .729 average.

Following Franklin in the scoring column are: Duffy with 167 points and an 11.8 average, Rask with 149 points and a 10.6, Bud Kuykendall with 125 points and an 8.9 average and Herron with 114 points and an 8.1 average.

Trophy Battle Slated Friday At Mac Court

Oregon's basketball Webfoots are currently drilling for their upcoming Pacific Coast Conference battle against Oregon State College this Friday night at McArthur Court.

Steve Belko's Webfoots will be out to revenge an earlier defeat at the hands of the Beavers. OSC won a season-opening clash at Mac Court 60-55 but both teams have progressed a long way since that opener.

The Ducks currently hold a 9-5 season record and are 2-4 against PCC competition. The Webfoot victories over conference competition came against Washington State and Washington State.

Oregon State, under the coaching of Slat Gill now in his 30th year at the Corvallis school, are one of the teams to beat in the PCC. They've won four of six loop games and boast a 12-3 over-all record, best among conference teams.

Should the Beavers win Friday, they will clinch the Chancellor's trophy which goes to the winner of each season's three-game rivalry. The Beavers have won the trophy each year since it was inaugurated in 1953.

The OSC squad has an all-American candidate in forward Dave Gambee who has averaged 17 points-per-game in PCC play. The versatile forward is also the conference's leading rebounder.

Last weekend Gambee broke the OSC individual career scoring record held by Cliff Crandall in 1946-49 of 1255 points.

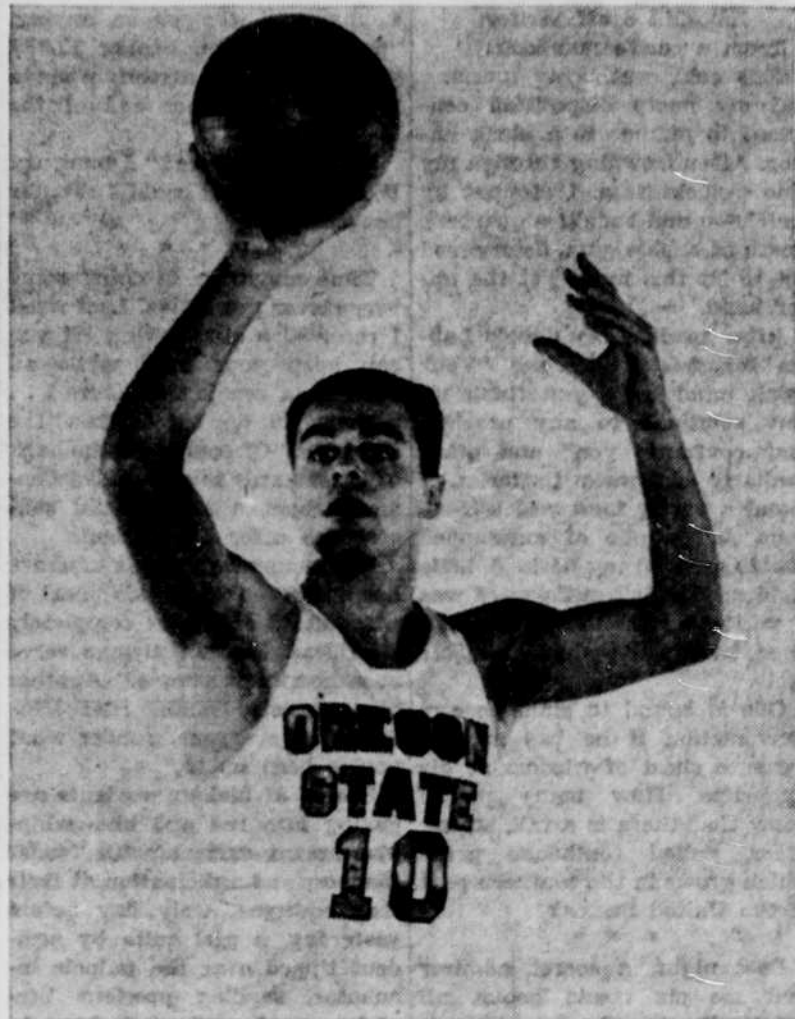
Forward Ken Nanson combines with Gambee to give the Beavers a strong front-line attack. Nanson recently scored 31 points in a game for a season high for OSC hoopers.

Oregon State has plenty of height, but not too much scoring power in its two centers, 6-8 Gary Goble and 6-9 Wayne Moss. The best depth for the Beavers comes at the guard position where they have no less than eight hoopers.

For the Ducks there is high scoring Charlie Franklin and Dale Herron at forwards, Hal Duffy at center, and Chuck Rask and Bud Kuykendall at guards.

The Beavers from Oregon State have a definite height advantage so Oregon will have to make the best of its speed and shooting accuracy.

Next Monday the Stanford Indians travel to McArthur Court to meet Oregon in another PCC contest.

Frosh Practices Foul Line Shots

The prescribed "medicine" for Oregon's Frosh cagers this week is a series of lengthy sessions at the free throw line. Don Kirsch's charges were edged by the Oregon State College Rooks, 58-56, Friday, mainly because of their inability to hit from the charity circle.

The Ducklings outshadowed their arch-rivals in almost every department but free tosses. Oregon had 29 gift chances during the contest and connected on only 10 of them for a meager .344 percentage.

The Rooks netted 10 of their 17 free tries, and, since the contest was neck-and-neck field goal-wise, won a game they shouldn't really have won. Oregon kept the contest even all the way despite the Rooks' height advantage and home-court situation.

OSC's home-court setting may have hurt the Ducklings somewhat, inasmuch as there was some mild dispute between Oregon coaches and the Rooks' official scorekeeper as to whether or not the Aggies had called too many time outs.

The Rook bookkeeper said his boys were without violation, so the argument was lost. Aside from the free toss performance, Coach Kirsch was pleased with the all-around good play of his squad and the development of the Frosh defense into a capable machine.

Save for a few errors which will iron out with experience, the Oregon defense was excellent from all quarters. Center Pudgy Hunt did a fine job of corraling rebounds, picking over 15 balls off the glass. Guard Leon Hayes had a terrific first-half on the scoring slate, netting 15 points in the first 20 minutes.

The Rook-Duckling "Little Civil War" feud resumes Friday evening at McArthur Court, when the two fives will square off at 6 p.m. in the second contest of their four-game series. The tilt is a preliminary to the Duck-Beaver Pacific Coast Conference clash at 8 p.m.
