

Pros Draft Duck Star

Jack Crabtree, Oregon's Rose Bowl quarterback, was drafted Tuesday by the Philadelphia Eagles of the National Football League. He was selected on the 12th round of 26 scheduled by pros in Philadelphia.

Crabtree had indicated he was interested in a professional career after he was voted the player of the Rose Bowl game by both the Helms Foundation and the Columbus, Ohio Touchdown Club.

The star quarterback threw 10 completed passes in the Pasadena classic and virtually kept the Ducks in the game against Ohio State's heavily-favored Buckeyes.

He ranked third in the Pacific Coast Conference passing records with 55 completed aeriels in 99 attempts for 624 yards, and he topped the first two ranking passers, Bobby Newman of Washington State and Jack Douglas of Stanford in completion percentage.

Vandal Hooper Paces PCC Point Averages

LOS ANGELES — The Idaho tandem of Gary Simmons and Hal Damiano leads the Pacific Coast Conference in scoring and shooting, respectively, according to basketball figures released today by the PCC Commissioner's office.

Simmons is scoring at an average of 23 points per game while Damiano has the best field goal percentage of 46.7 per cent. Don McIntosh of California with 84.6 per cent on free throws and Oregon State's Dave Gambee, a 15.8 per cent rebounder, head other statistical departments.

Simmons has scored 54 field goals and 53 free throws for a total of 161 points in his first seven games and his only serious contender at this stage is Doug Smart of Washington who is 18 points back in the same number of games. Smart's game average is 20.4. Charlie Franklin, Oregon, has moved into third place with a 17.5 average, followed by Gambee, 16.5, and Jim Pugh, Southern California, 12.9.

Rounding out the top ten in scoring are Ken Nanson, OSC, 12.8; Dick Axelsson, WSC; Whaylon Coleman, Idaho, and Walt Torrence, UCLA, all 12.0; and Monte Gonzales USC, 11.9.

Damiano has scored on 28 of 60 field goal attempts for his 46.7 per cent and he is followed closely by Smart, 46.5 per cent, and Gambee, 46.3 per cent. Conrad Burke, UCLA, is shooting 45.3 per cent and Bill Stady, Washington, 45 per cent.

McIntosh has made 22 of 26 free throw attempts in compiling his 84.6 per cent. Sec-
