

Study Awards Available

The annual Tri Delta General Scholarship fund competition opened Jan. 11, and will be open for applications until the deadline, March 1.

One scholarship for \$300 will be awarded to an incoming senior, and a scholarship for \$200 will be awarded to an incoming junior. The only requirements are that the applicant need financial assistance in order to continue studies at the University of Oregon. The applicant need not be a Tri Delta member.

Lloyd Fellowship

A \$750 Alice Crocker Lloyd Fellowship is available for any member of Alpha Lambda Delta who has maintained the required grade point average and who graduated in 1956-1957 or will graduate this spring.

Other information may be secured from the Dean of Women or by writing to the National Fellowship Chairman. The deadline for submitting applications is Feb. 15.

DZ Award

The annual \$500 scholarship sponsored by the Delta Zeta sorority will be awarded to a student studying in Audiology and allied fields.

The applicant should be a

graduate or undergraduate woman student, with junior or senior standing, who wishes to continue study in Audiology or in applied areas in speech and hearing. The applicant need not be a Delta Zeta member in order to be eligible.

Applications and all pertinent data should be filled out and mailed to the Scholarship Committee on or before April 1, 1958.

ZTA Scholarship

Zeta Tau Alpha Foundation Scholarship Awards are now available for qualified graduate and undergraduate students. The awards vary in amount according to need, however undergraduate awards do not exceed \$300.

Preference is given to applicants who are seniors and who are studying in the fields of education. Ranking students in other areas of study will be considered, with a special award available in the fields of physical therapy, speech correction, occupational therapy, or in teaching of handicapped children. A "B" average and high character recommendations are required.

Applications must be submitted before May 15. Applicants will be notified by July 15.

Short Story

An annual award for the best short story written by a University student has been established. The fund was set up by Mrs.

Ernest Haycox in memory of her late husband, a northwest writer.

Prizes of \$100 for the best work and \$50 for second place will be awarded each spring by a committee appointed by the University president. Awards will not be made during years when no quality work is submitted for consideration.

The award, known as the Ernest Haycox Short Story Prize, was established to stimulate interest in high quality literary work. Competition is open to either graduate or undergraduate students.

Mr. Haycox, who died in 1950, was an active alumnus and writer of many short stories about the West and about Oregon.
