

Tight Thrillers Dot IM Action

Three close games highlighted a slim intramural slate in B basketball Wednesday.

Kimpton Remains Leading Duckling

Guard Butch Kimpton again remained in most of the top positions in eight-game statistics for Oregon's Frosh basketballers.

Kimpton, sharp-shooting guard from Klamath Falls, still leads the Ducklings in individual game scoring with a 12.5 points-per-game mark. Forward Denny Strickland is pressing Kimpton for the lead with a 10.5 average in the eight Frosh games so far.

Kimpton's 43 field goals, 15 free tosses out of 19 chances, and 101 total points top all others.

Center Ron Anderson holds the personal foul lead with 17 infractions.

Oregon's total figures are far above those of the Frosh's opponents. So far, Don Kirsch's men have a 74.0 scoring average to the opposition's 56.4. Only in the free throw department is there any semblance of closeness, and Kirsch has the Ducklings drilling hard on their charity efforts this week.

The Frosh's 58-56 loss to the OSC Rooks Friday night placed Oregon's current won-lost mark at 6-2, with eight contests left to go, including three more with the Rooks.

The second meeting with the Aggie yearlings will occur Friday at 6 p.m. in McArthur Court.

6. Tuesday, May 21—Don Kirsch's Oregon baseball squad won the Northern Division baseball title today even though they didn't meet a loop club. Oregon State handed the ND title to the Ducks by losing a pair of games to Washington 5-2 and 9-7. The Webfoots now have lost two games and the Beavers six with only two games remaining on each team's schedule.

7. Saturday, October 5—Oregon's spirited Webfoot gridders shook off the odds of a jinx, effects of the flu and condition of a muddy field tonight to defeat UCLA's favored Bruins 21-0 before a small, but noisy crowd in Portland's Multnomah Stadium. The victory vaulted Len Casanova's troops into the number one position of the Pacific Coast Conference with a record of two wins and no losses, and ended a UCLA dominance in the series which had lasted since 1948.

8. Saturday, March 9—Steve Belko's Oregon basketball Ducks closed an otherwise dismal 1956-57 basketball season on a happy note tonight as they handed Oregon State's heavily-favored Beavers a 65-61 thumping at McArthur Court. The visiting Beavers had beaten the Ducks easily in two earlier season games but Oregon forgot to look at the odds as they better than matched their "Civil War" neighbors point for point.

Saturday, March 2—Oregon's freshman hoopers, down by 11 points early in the second half, put on a tremendous rally to defeat Oregon State's Rooks 57-46 tonight at OSC's Gill Coliseum and complete their first undefeated season in 19 years. Don Kirsch's Ducklings won 15 games during the season including four over the Rooks.

10. Tuesday, May 28—Phi Delta Theta finished second to Sigma Phi Epsilon in the new intramural track tournament today to clinch for the third time in succession the all-IM championship. The Phi Delt's racked up 819 points to edge out the Sig Eps with 807. It was the Phi Delt's ninth IM championship in 20 years.
