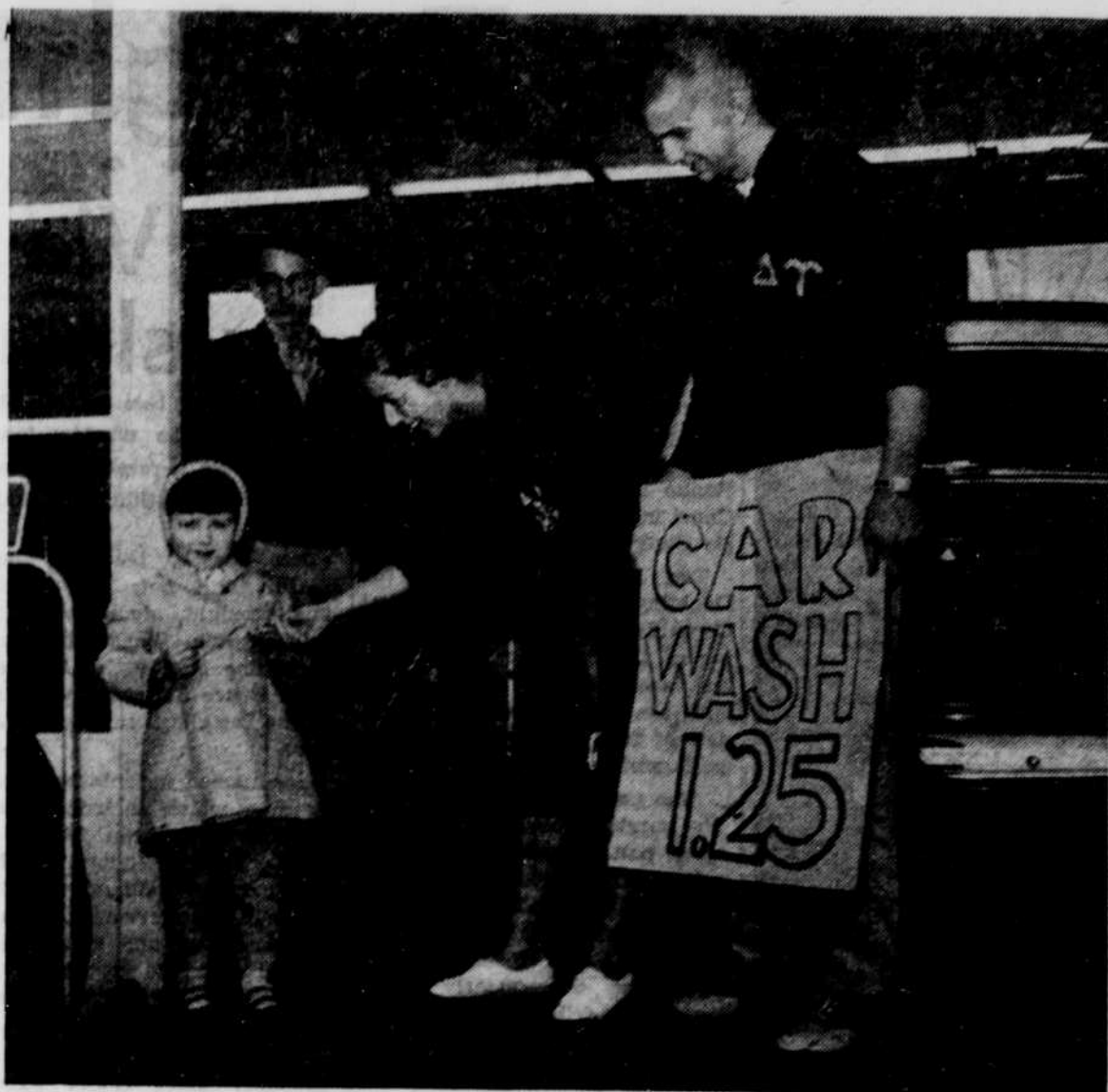

year. He was absent Thursday night. George Brandt, who has been present for six of the meetings and absent for four, was two hours late Thursday.

However, Brandt was late for three of the times he was present, according to the secretary's records.

Makes Sudden Entrance

At the time Smith was speaking, Brandt walked into the meeting, which had been in progress for some two hours.

"I believe that I have a fairly good reason for my absences," Brandt said, when he had been informed of Smith's comments. "We've had Pershing Rifles initiation and meetings for two weeks."

Pershing Rifles is the Army ROTC honorary.

"Doesn't the Senate take precedence over that?" one of the Senators asked.

"It just depends..." Brandt replied.

Smith reaffirmed his opinion that the Senate should take some action against senators who did not attend meetings, and commented that although he did not have any formal action to propose, he brought up the subject for Senate consideration.
