

UT Schedules Comedy Tryouts

Tryouts will be held beginning Monday, for parts in the University Theatre's fifth production of the season, William Congreve's comedy "The Way of the World."

The play, considered the greatest of Restoration comedies, has parts for eight men and eight women of various types and ages.

The director, Daniel Krempel, assistant professor of speech, suggests that those trying out read the play beforehand if possible. The play is widely anthologized in collections of English drama.

Tryout times are: Monday, 8 p.m. in the Lab Theatre, 102 Villard; Tuesday, 3 to 5 p.m. and 8 p.m., 102 Villard; and Wednesday, 8 p.m., 192 Villard.

Director Krempel is also seeking an assistant director for this production. Interested persons should contact him at the speech department.

Suggestions for tryout scenes are posted on the speech department and Green Room bulletin boards in Villard Hall.
