Visual-aid speeches will be made at the meet, which will be attended by nine schools of the Intercollegiate Forensic Association of Oregon.

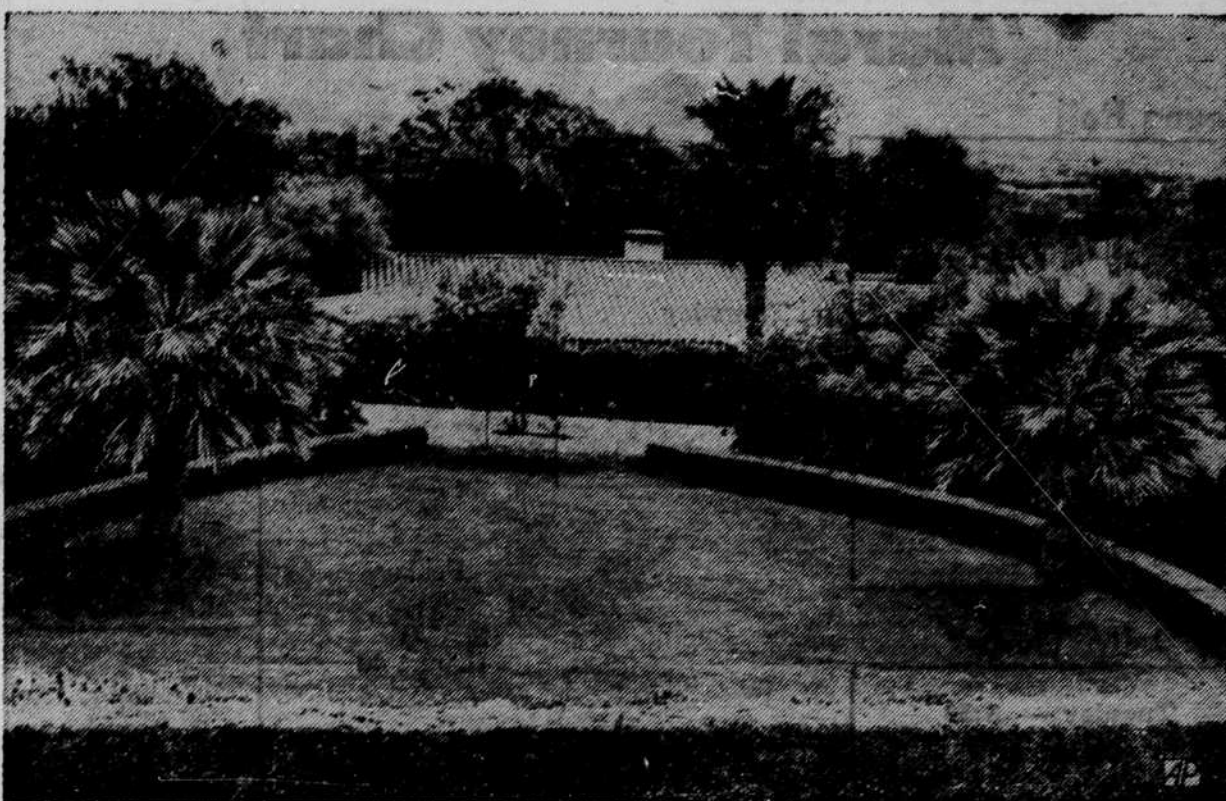
Miss Denton will use slides to illustrate her talk, "A Recent Trip through Italy."
