

Grant, K. Falls, No. Salem Fives Top Prep Picks

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 ber three ranked North Salem. Roosevelt placed second in the Portland Interscholastic League and North Salem placed first in the District eight race.

Roosevelt has an overall record of 18 wins and four losses while the Capitol city cagers have won 19 and lost three.

Wednesday afternoon's slate in opening round action will pit Hermiston of District seven against TYV and District Four champion St. Helens.

Hermiston gained a spot in the tournament by edging The Dalles last Saturday night by a 49-47 score. St. Helens had a 12-2 record in TYV action to cinch the league laurels as well as a state tourney berth. The Hermiston-St. Helens contest starts at 1:45 p.m.

Roseburg of District five tangles with Bend of District eight in the 3:00 p.m. game Wednesday afternoon. Roseburg finished second to Springfield and gained a tournament spot by downing Marshfield 52-49.

Bend was the first team to ice down a trip to the state hoop tourney about a month ago. Roseburg is in the number six spot in the latest prep poll and Bend is unranked. Roseburg has a 16-6 record for the season.

The first game Wednesday evening finds Grants Pass of District six meeting Metro champion Astoria at 7:30. Grants Pass defeated Ashland 54-49 on Saturday night to gain the second spot from the sixth district.

Astoria rated number five in the state holds a 19-3 record for the season and won the Metro league title with a 13-1 record.

The final game of the opening round slates unbeaten Grant, champion of the Portland league, against Corvallis of District eight.

Grant is the second-rated team in the state and has a record of 22-0 for the season. Corvallis gained a tourney berth last week by upsetting North Salem 55-47.

A highlight following the championship game on Saturday night will be the selection of the All-State team and awarding of various trophies to schools at the tournament.

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Win Over Cal Heads Record

 The Webfoots won 13 and lost 11 over the season's route. They opened the season with a 7-1 pre-conference record, those seven victories coming in succession.

Oregon's 6-10 conference record included single victories over California, Stanford, Washington State and Idaho and two wins over Washington.

The Cal triumph was probably the Ducks' top win of the year. Their victories over Washington and Idaho also rate high among the season's performances.

Against the Bears last Friday, Oregon hit an unbelievable .667 of its shots, breaking the old PCC record of .633 set by Idaho in a 1945 game. The tight California defenses allowed the Webfoots only 42 shots at the basket, but 28 of those casts dropped through the hoop.

Oregon racked up a .382 shooting percentage over the season's route and averaged 64.3 points per game. The Webfoots' 24 opponents averaged 64.9 points.

Charlie Franklin, who with Fial Duffy, Wimp Hastings and Paul Tucharadt played their last game for Oregon against Stanford, paced the Ducks in virtually every scoring department.

The 6-3 forward scored 422 points for a 17.6 average over the complete season and broke the

University career scoring record by 19 points. Franklin tallied 1092 points in three years as an Oregon regular.

He ranked third in PCC scoring with 19.3.



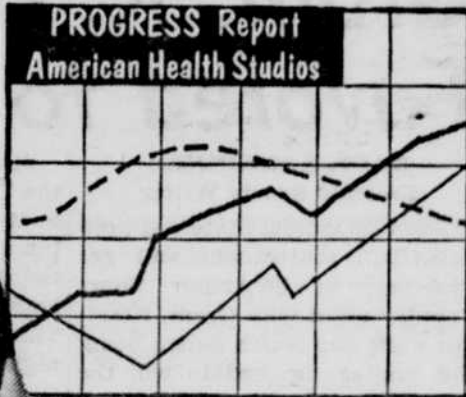
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
