

Oregon Nine Slates 'Spring Training' Trip

Oregon's baseball squad, blessed by sunny weather in pre-season drill sessions, open their 1958 schedule this spring vacation with their annual "spring training" trip to California.

The Webfoots, defending Northern Division champions, will meet Santa Clara for the first time, California, defending NCAA champions, San Jose State, Sacramento State and the California Aggies.

Coach Don Kirsch has 13 lettermen back from his Northern Division championship squad. Included in the group are six starters and three proved pitchers, headed by catcher Ellis Olson, who topped the Webfoot hitting department last year with a .341 average and pitcher Ron Whittacker who won eight games and lost

only one for the Ducks in 1957. Last year's Oregon squad won 11 and lost three in ND play and rolled to a 24-7 season record. They dropped two straight contests to California in the PCC playoff games, but the Bears went on to win the national collegiate title.

Kirsch's 1958 squad has a surplus of returnees in the infield, but has only one regular outfielder back from last year's team.

Several sophomores up from last year's freshman squad and some junior college transfers will help to fill the gaps.

All told, the Ducks should have a strong entry in this season's Northern Division race which opens in mid-April. Washington State and Oregon State appear to be the main obstacles in Oregon's way.

The Webfoots will meet each of the four ND clubs, Oregon State, Washington, Washington State and Idaho four times on a home-and-home basis.

Ducklings Work Out For April 10 Opener

Over 30 Oregon Frosh baseball enthusiasts will work through Friday at getting over the effects of a long spring-to-spring layoff in preparation for their 1958 15-game season, slated to start April 10.

Pitching and catching prospects have been working out the kinks since March 3, while the entire squad, over 30 strong, turned out Monday to begin their limbering-up period.

Pitchers have been working in the confines of Mac Court and the PE gyms on control and hurling form. Tuesday the entire team ran and tuned up on calisthenics. Tuesday, the prospects had a couple of turns in the batting cages in the unfinished PE area and hit off batting tees.

Coached by Norv Ritchey, veteran Duckling mentor and former Oregon star, the Frosh will have a two-week layoff between final week and the start of Spring term, but all players have been encouraged to work out on their own.

Competition for all nine starting positions is apparently going to be heated, with candidates approximately four-deep at every spot.

The 1958 season officially opens April 10, and will run a 15-game course, the maximum allowed by the Pacific Coast Conference.

Oregon Net Squad Faces Better Year

Improvement, and lots of it, should be evident in Coach Dick Williams' 1958 version of the University of Oregon tennis team. Fighting to better last year's 3-8 record will be a squad composed of some of the old and some of the new.

Two of last year's brightest lights in the tennis picture, Juniors Wayne Henninger and Larry Ottis, return and should be close to the top on the Oregon tennis ladder. Other returning lettermen include Seniors Marv Wood and Phil Lowthian, and Junior Bruce Dingler.

Stepping up to varsity competition after fine freshman play last year are Gary Rink and Phil Northgate, two boys to watch.

Oregon stakes tennis fortunes on the block Saturday, April 5 in the opening match of the year against Oregon Medical School at Portland.

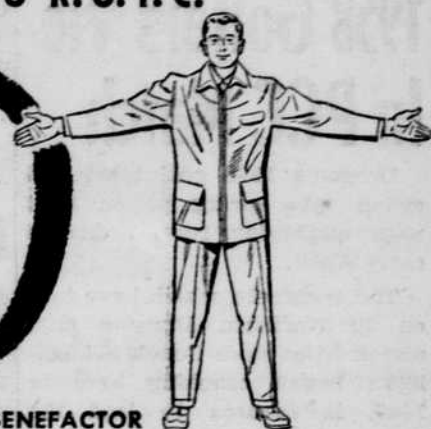
