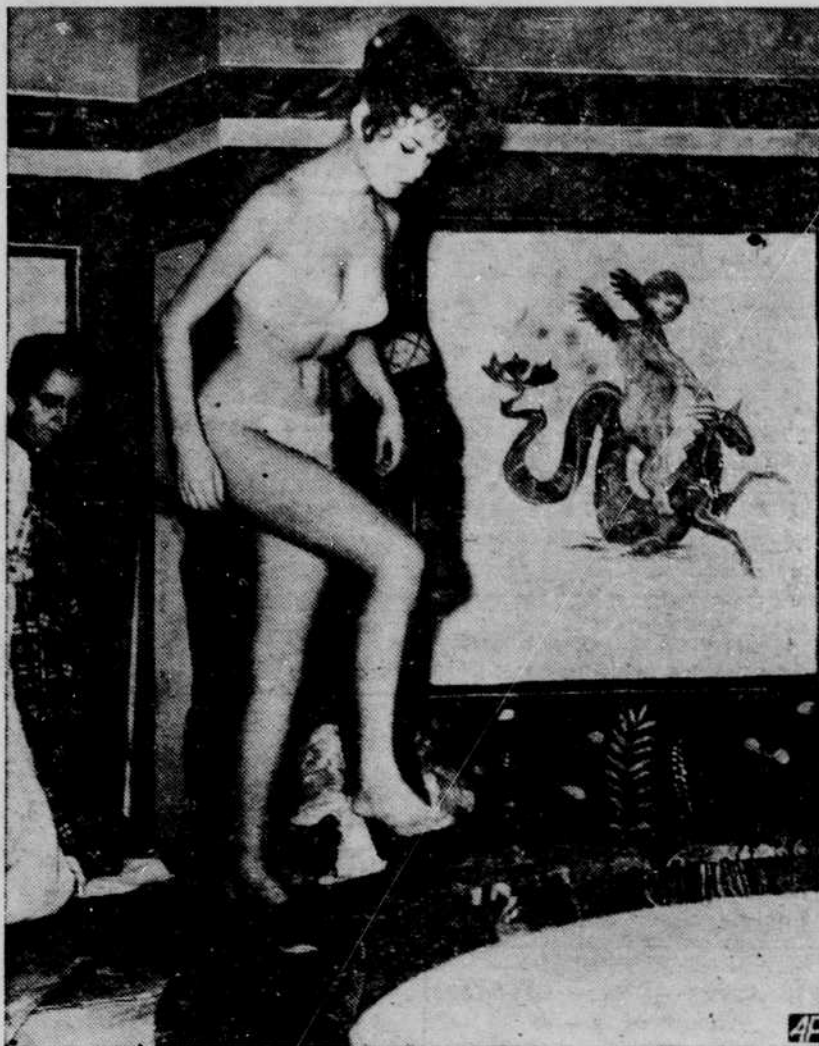

## Pi Phis Raided By Vice Squad; Police Shocked

Hastily wrapped in garish drapery ripped from windows at the last minute, scores of dejected men and women were led from the Pi Beta Phi house dance Saturday night.

A special bus had been chartered by local and state police to hold the scantily-clad fugitives. Police would not disclose how many had been jailed, but one house mother was heard to say in shock: "What, all my pretty ones? All gone in one fell swoop? Oh, hellkite!"

### One Woman Blabs

Police had been tipped off by what was termed "a phone call by an unidentified older woman." They stationed a cordon around the house but waited until plainclothesmen had infiltrated the dance.

Sighed one plainclothesman, "We might as well have worn our uniforms. We stood out like sore thumbs."

The theme of the dance was "Roamin' Orgy," revealed Mrs. Golda P. Wickham, who gave most of the above details from her investigation. Mrs. Wickham said that the raid was part of the basis of her crackdown on "all social activities."

### Dance Unscheduled

"It was not so much the theme of the dance or even how closely it was followed that was so shocking," stated Mrs. Wickham. "It was just that the whole affair was unscheduled. No dances were scheduled during spring vacation. They were just trying to get two dances during winter term and I won't tolerate it. I repeat, I will not tolerate it."

The dance was alleged to have started late Friday night and is said to have continued until the Saturday night raid. The Wickham report states that no one left the house throughout the party until Saturday night when neighbors sighted several couples "resting" on the sunporches.

### Booze Buried

Police found that "many cases of assorted alcoholic beverages had been cached in the middle of the living room floor."

Police are still holding several students who became "unruly, strong willed, ill-tempered and just plain cantankerous." One coed said, "I don't care if they hold me, it's just how they hold me. I mean, I should be able to phone my friend and have her sign me out."

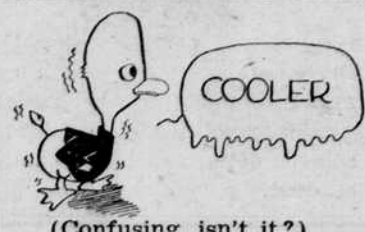
