'Theatre Excitement' at UT Discusses Atomic Problems

University Theater's yearly "Theatre Excitement" marked its ninth production with an exciting and thought-provoking experimental play, "E=mc²" by Hallie Flanagan Davis, last Friday and Saturday nights.

"Living Newspaper"

Defined as "a living newspaper about the atomic age" it was comprised of multitudinous scenes depicting reactions to the big explosion all over the world. This was all expertly tied together by a character named Atom, and the overseer of the whole production, the stage manager, who walked on and off when tying scenes together was deemed necessary.

This is an actor's play. It is primarily for their enjoyment, as the stage manager, played by Horace Robinson, said. He further explained that if the audience enjoyed it, good. If not, so what!

Well, there certainly wasn't much "so what" about this production. It was thoroughly enjoyable, on both sides of the big gauze curtain.

The production, naturally enough, received its vitality from atomic power. In this case the elements of the atom were Joyce Niedringhaus, who reacted all over the stage in a most engaging fashion. As the impetuous atom she spent her incalculable energies blowing up cities, curing cancer, creating a perfume of the future, guaranteed to knockout men, and

above all else trying to convince the audience that they had better use her right or else.

The last article in the "living newspaper" was the complete destruction of the world.

Technically the show was a constant surprise. The Technique of Acting Class, the force behind the production, used lights, sets, and sounds to great and often unusual advantage.

The production moved at a fast pace, though it was slowed at times by what seemed to me several unnecessary dancing episodes, but then the dancers were enjoying themselves, so I guess it was all right.
