Millrace Sailors Learn Water Safety Techniques

The Infirmary has been doing a booming business in tetanus shots... and campus clotheslines were heavy this week with wet sports clothing. The reason? The University is again giving preparatory lessons in canoeing conduct.

Perhaps the present generation of students isn't as hale and hearty as their fathers, who at the turn of the century and afterwards didn't require shots and practice exercises to perform millrace high jinks.

However, canoeing on the 'race has taken on several modern aspects. There's now the two-year-old Millrace boathouse, which

tries to outwit spring and fall term weather to promote the sport. A tradition of competition, usually featuring untried and gung-ho teams from living organizations, has been established with the Millrace Olympics.

A number of Millrace houses have been quietly building up a flotilla of canoes, preparing for springtime warfare, and the boatless organizations have been storing up waterbagging materials.

Early reports on the first few sessions of the physical education school's version of the sport haven't mentioned these unsci-
