

Ducklings Open 1958 Schedule Against Linfield

Oregon's Freshman baseball squad opens its 1958 slate this afternoon at 3 with a contest against the Linfield JV's. The game will be played on the lower field according to Duckling coach Norv Ritchey.

The Webfoot varsity is playing the Linfield varsity on Howe Field thus necessitating the Ducklings to play on the practice field.

Denny Peterson will be the opening game pitcher for the Frosh with Jerry Bertrand opening behind the plate. Peterson and Bertrand are both from The Dalles. The remainder of the starting nine for the opener has not been selected as yet.

The Duckling schedule which opens today, will end on May 17 with a game against the OSC Rooks. The Frosh will meet the Beaver Rooks four times during the season with two games scheduled at Oregon and two at OSC.

The Ducklings hope to reverse their showing of last year against OSC as the Rooks defeated the Frosh three out of four times last year.

The Oregon freshmen defeated the Beavers in the first contest played between the two clubs last year and then lost three straight.

The Webfoot Frosh will also meet Clark JC, OCE JV's and Linfield JV's during the 1958 slate. Four battles are slated with Clark on a home and home basis.

Two games are scheduled with OCE and the Frosh will play a doubleheader at Linfield against the Wildcat JV's later in the season.

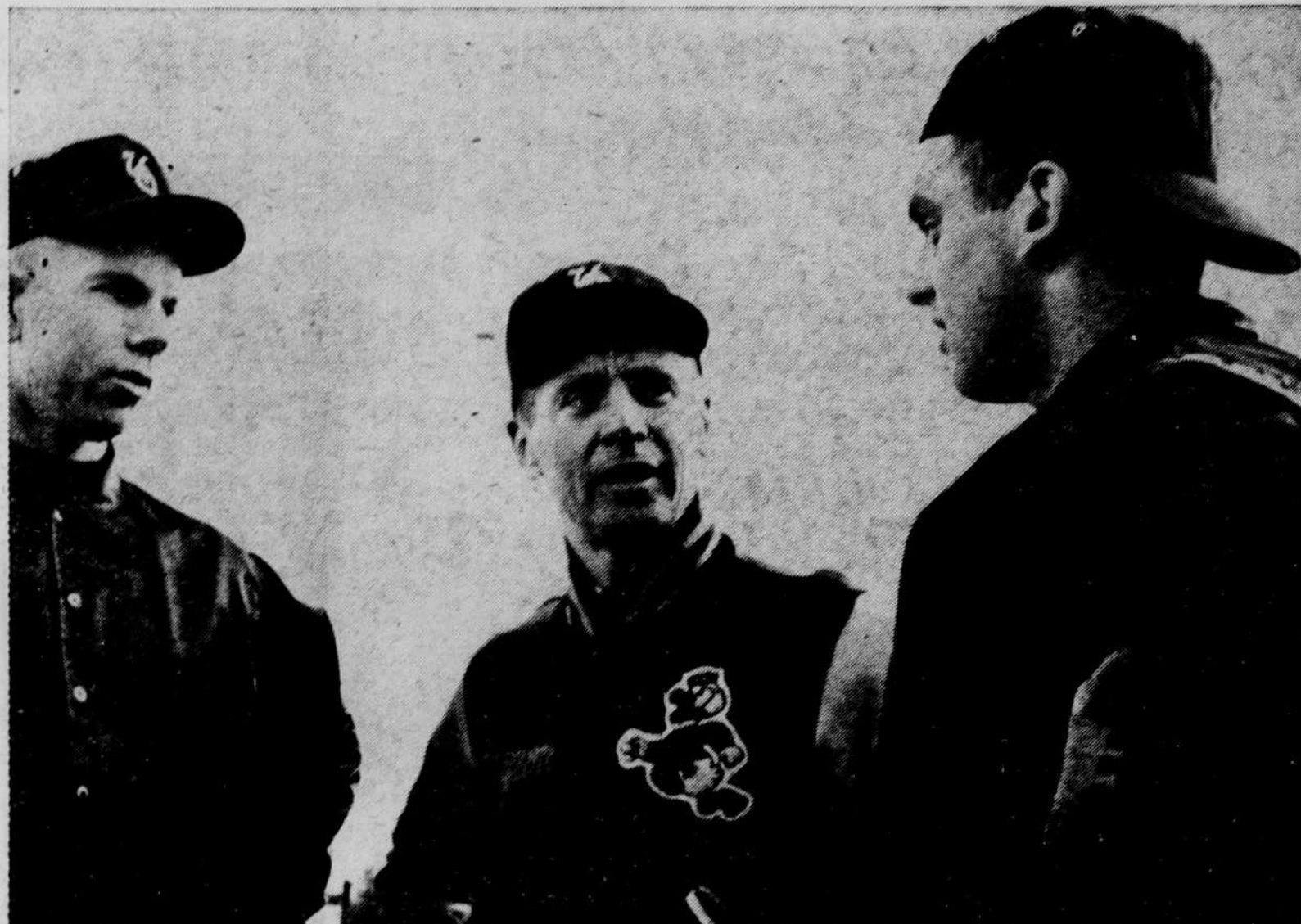
