

Junior Honorary Calls for Petitions

Petition deadline for Phi Theta Upsilon, junior women's service honorary, has been set at 5 p.m. April 18 at the ASUO petition box according to Dorothy Gambelin, president.

Eligible for the honorary, which annually taps 20 members at the all-campus luncheon during Junior Week, are sophomore women with a grade point average of 2.6, and with University grades of a 2.0 for winter term.

Activities for the petitions may be listed under the categories of campus, women's and miscellaneous activities. Petitions should be stamped by the Office of the Dean of Women. No picture is required.

The honorary holds several events during the year, in addition to its money raising activities to benefit scholarship funds. Ushering and selling of football programs are two of the activi-

ties which benefit the organization's treasury.

'Rapids Running' Billed Saturday

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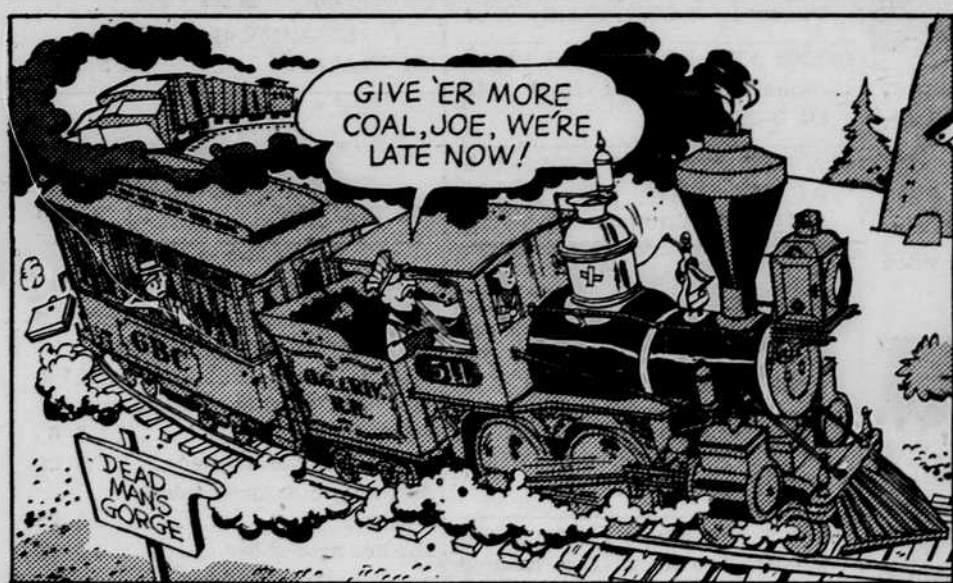
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
