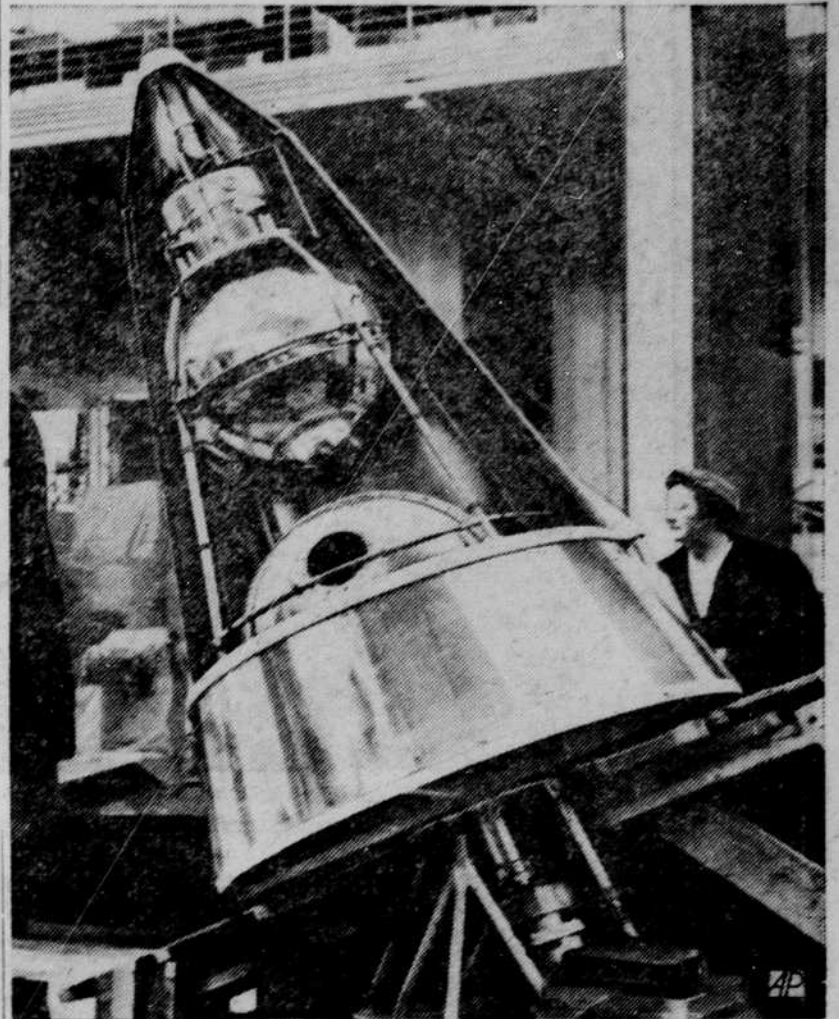

Belko, Brittingham Agreement Reached

George Brittingham and coach Steve Belko reached an agreement Friday about Brittingham's proposal that four reserve basketball players be added to the list of letter-winners by Belko.

Thursday night at the ASUO Senate meeting, Brittingham said that the four—George Padovan, Jerry Anderson, Paul Tucharadt, and Otis Davis—should be awarded letters since their playing time totals were nearly equal to one of the seven letter-winners.

At the time, Senator Bud Titus pointed out that the letter-winners who perhaps had the least amount of playing time had been injured and probably would have played much more if he had not been hurt.

Friday, it was pointed out that "Wimp" Hastings had been sidelined for a month and would probably have played much more otherwise; that George Padovan had been released from the team for disciplinary reasons; and that Anderson, Tucharadt, and Davis had not played enough minutes to be eligible for a letter.

At the Senate meeting, Brittingham, graduate representative said, "Belko was available to tell the press that the 1958 Oregon team was one of the more inferior he had coached." Brittingham said Sunday that he and Art Litchman, athletic publicity director, discovered Friday that a sports columnist had noted that

Belko had said that the 1958 squad had been inferior to the previous year's team in some respect. There was not a direct quote from the coach, however.

Brittingham told the Emerald Sunday night that he still thinks that more letters should have been awarded this season, proportionately, since the Webfoots had a better won-loss record. He said that he will continue to support his contention, and that the Senate ought to look into the letter-awarding situation.

and his Ph.D. in 1945 from the University of London. He also attended Roan School, Greenwich, and Shoreditch Technical Institute, London.

Author of such standard works as "Southeast Asia" and "Senior Geography for Malaysians", Dobby has also contributed to scholarly publications many articles on Spain, on Malaya, and S. E. Asia.

Dobby is a long standing Fellow of the Royal Geographical Society in London, a member of the American Geographic Society, and also the Royal Institute of International Affairs, in London.

Paul L. Kleinsorge, professor of economics, will lead the discussion after the lecture.

Dobby was largely responsible for the report that brought about the establishment of a Polytechnic in Singapore in 1953-54.
