MOSCOW, Idaho (AP) — Veteran left hander Don Lane, who would be a candidate for any Northern Division baseball hall of fame, pitched a no-hit, no-run game Thursday as Oregon beat Idaho 11-0.

Untouchable Lane, 22-year-old senior from San Lorenzo, Calif., faced only 31 batters in his nine-inning stint. He struck out 11 and gave up three walks.

One Vandal became a base runner on an infield error by Oregon.

The Ducks took up where they left off clobbering the Vandals 10-2 Wednesday, with a blistering 19-hit attack. They scored five in the first off Idaho starter Clark Anderson and then coasted in behind the splendid pitching of Lane.

The victorious pitcher was also one of the big hitters, with three for five.

Oregon catcher Ellis Olson got four for five, including a triple and home run and three runs batted in. Olson comes from nearby Lewiston, Idaho.

Two Idaho pitchers, Anderson and Jack Bloxom, couldn't stem

the Oregon attack. The Webfeet hit safely in every inning except the eighth.

They added insult to injury with a four-run outburst in the ninth.

The victory means a series sweep for the Ducks and kept them well on top of ND standings with a 7-1 record. They play Washington State Friday and Saturday. WSC and Oregon State are tied for second.
