(Continued from page one) A controversy arose at that time when George Brittingham, graduate representative on the Senate, questioned the list of candidates and presented four additional Duck players for consideration.

#### **Explanation Read**

For Thursday night's meeting. a letter of explanation was read from Coach Belko, who could not attend because of a previous speaking engagement; and further clarifications were made by Art Litchman, Athletic publicity

Litchman presented figures indicating the actual playing time recorded for Otis Davis, Paul Tuchardt, George Padovan and Jerry Anderson as compared to the 140 minutes required for letters, and noted that the Senate has power to pass or veto letter nominees, and not to recommend players for letters.

After a discussion of comparative playing times for the four, Brittingham "dropped his case" for Davis, Tuchardt and Padovan, and moved that Jerry Anderson be recommended for a letter, and that the Senate not approve the Athletic Department list until Anderson's name had been added to the list. This motion failed.

Brittingham then moved that the Senate recommend to Belko that Anderson's name be added to the letter list. The motion was called out of order, for being in meaning a repetition of the first.
