### Senate approves

A controversy arose at that time when George Brittingham, graduate representative on the Senate, questioned the list of candidates and presented four additional Duck players for consideration.

#### Explanation Read

For Thursday night's meeting, a letter of explanation was read from Coach Belko, who could not attend because of a previous speaking engagement; and further clarifications were made by Art Litchman, Athletic publicity director.

Litchman presented figures indicating the actual playing time recorded for Otis Davis, Paul Tucharth, George Padovan and Jerry Anderson as compared to the 140 minutes required for letters, and noted that the Senate has power to pass or veto letter nominees, and not to recommend players for letters.

After a discussion of comparative playing times for the four, Brittingham "dropped his case" for Davis, Tucharth and Padovan, and moved that Jerry Anderson be recommended for a letter, and that the Senate not approve the Athletic Department list until Anderson's name had been added to the list. This motion failed.

Brittingham then moved that the Senate recommend to Belko that Anderson's name be added to the letter list. The motion was called out of order, for being in meaning a repetition of the first. Following this, Bud Titus' motion that the original list be accepted was passed.

### Ike welcomes Nixon

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Eisenhower warmly welcomed Vice President Nixon home from South America Thursday and said communist-inspired riots against him there would simply strengthen inter-American friendship.

From thousands of citizens and well-wishers there was a roaring welcome for the Vice President and his wife.

### Trade bill ok'd

WASHINGTON (AP)—A five-year compromise extension of the reciprocal trade program was approved Thursday by the House Ways and Means Committee. It contains most of what President Eisenhower asked but makes his tariff authority subject to congressional review.

### Algerian scene tense

ALGIERS (AP)—Military rule covered almost all of tinderbox Algeria Thursday amid signs that the army command is leaning more and more toward local right wingers and away from the new government in Paris.

In Paris, Gen. Charles De Gaulle said he is ready to serve France if called upon but did not state his conditions. In the past he has always demanded a free hand.

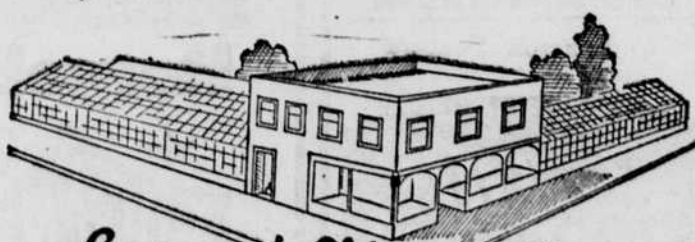
