

Theta Chi squad topples Phi Delt in three contests

Intramural B volleyball got off to a discouraging start Wednesday when the first two games of the day were forfeited.

Cherney Hall did not show up to play their match with Hunter, and French Hall was credited with a win in the absence of their opponents, Young Hall.

However the afternoon was not a complete loss when Alpha Tau Omega and Sigma Nu started off the day's games.

Although both teams appeared to be slightly rusty in their play, the ATO team was the least rusty of the two. They won their match in two very close games 12-10 and 11-9.

The most exciting and tension-filled match played during the afternoon was the three games played between Phi Delta Theta and Theta Chi.

The Phi Delt put together good court play and service to win the first game decidedly, 13-3.

However Theta Chi came back in the second fracas when the Phi Delt defense wavered and then outmaneuvered the Phi Delt defense to win 12-6.

In the last game of the series Theta Chi hit the ball where the Phi Delt weren't. At times it looked like the Phi Delt might stop the Theta attack, but then lost a hard fought game 12-6.

In a later match, Delta Tau Delta whipped Sigma Phi Epsilon in two games 10-1, 13-5.

The Delt started right off scoring points, displaying in the process good court play, serving, and team spirit over their out-manned opponents.

The last match of the afternoon pitted Sigma Alpha Epsilon against Phi Gamma Delta. The SAE's won the first game easily 15-6 when the Fiji's had trouble getting their offensive organized.

But they pulled themselves together to win the second game 14-9 when the SAE defense fell apart. The third game was a see-saw battle with the SAE's pulling ahead half way through the game to maintain a 12-5 score until the end of the game.

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Kapp sets pace in PCC offense

Joe Kapp of California is the total offense leader in Pacific Coast Conference football after eight weekends of play, according to statistics released by the office of PCC Acting Commissioner, Bernie Hammerbeck.

Kapp has a total of 926 yards rushing and passing, to rank ahead of Bob Hivner of Washington, who has 649, and Bob Nicolet of Stanford who has 604. Leading rusher for all games through November 8 is Joe Kapp with 470 yards. No. 2 on the ground is Charles Morrell of Washington State, with 405 yards, while Willie West of Oregon has 375.

Top passer is Bob Nicolet of Stanford, having completed 62 of 117 passes for 598 yards. Bob Newman of Washington State has completed 49 passes for 511 yards, and Dick Norman of Stanford 42 passes for 325 yards.

Leading the pass receivers is Chris Burford of Stanford with 34 catches for 373 yards. Bob Dehlinger of Idaho is second with 25 receptions, while Irv Nikolai of Stanford had 24. Leader in interceptions is Jim Norton of Idaho with 4 for 66 yards.

Leading scorer in the Conference is Bill Patton of California with 56 points. Jack Hart of California has 34 and Gail Cogdill of Washington State has 32.

Top man in the punting Department is Dainard Paulson of Oregon State with a 42.3 yard average per kick. Keith Lincoln of Washington State has averaged 39.2 yards and Rick McMillen of Stanford 38.4 yards.

John Horrillo of Oregon State has amassed the most yards on punt returns, 160, for an average of 10.7 yards per runback. Luther Carr of Washington has returned for 100 yards and Wayne Crow, California, for 78 yards.

Willie West of Oregon has returned kickoffs for 192 yards while Luther Carr is second with 191 yards and Jim Byrer of Stanford has 154.

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California is the total offense leader in the Pacific Coast Conference with an average of 316.4 yards per play, according to team statistics released by the office of PCC Acting Commissioner Bernie Hammerbeck.

Figures released by the PCC office showed Oregon the No. 1 defensive team with a 219.6 yard average, to 226.0 for Washington State. Oregon leads in rushing defense, having allowed 145.7 yards and Washington State is first in pass defense, having permitted 60.4 yards.

California is first in rushing with a 244.4 yard average and Washington State is first in passing with 147.8 yard average. Oregon moved to second in total offense.

Best punting team is UCLA with an average of 38.6 yards per kick, and UCLA also leads in interceptions, having picked off 14. California has averaged 10.0 yards per runback on punt returns to lead the Conference in that department, while Washington State has an average of 20.4 on kickoff returns.
