

Ducks in good shape for Bruins

Oregon gridders went through a 40-minute offensive scrimmage Tuesday afternoon in preparation for their upcoming PCC battle on Saturday with UCLA.

The Ducks rate as a six-point favorite, but the Bruins will prove a formidable foe for the favored Webfoots. UCLA, how-

ever, was also an underdog against the league-leading California Bears last Saturday and lost by a heartbreaking 20-17 score. The Bruins outgained the victorious Bears 233 to 224 yards.

Despite the fact that the Uclans have lost the services of several penalized seniors they still have some fine player personnel. Fullback Ray Smith who gained 58 yards in 13 carries against Cal will prove a threat to Oregon's stout defense.

Other talented Bruin performers are wingback Phil Parslow, tailback Skip Smith, blocking back Art Phillips, wingback John Davis, guard Mike Riskas and end John Brown.

UCLA's sophomore tailback, Bill Kilmer, who has been sidelined for five games due to a wrist injury may be ready for action against the fifth place Webfoots on Saturday.

Bruins Parslow and Brown suffered ankle injuries in the Cal game and UCLA coach Bill Barnes hopes that the two stalwarts will be able to play.

The Ducks appear to be in their best physical condition in several weeks as most of the gridders who have been sidelined with injuries in recent

games will be available for action.

Whether veteran end Ron Stover will play is still doubtful and he may see only limited duty. Joe Schaffeld and Stover did not take part in Oregon's 40 minute offensive scrimmage held Tuesday.

Reserve halfback Herman

McKinney will not be in action Saturday at Los Angeles as the funeral services for his father, who died last Saturday, will be held in Portland Saturday.

Both opponents are drilling hard and should be ready to go all out in possibly the last contest of the 28-game rivalry.

UCLA's single wing and spread formation offense promises to cause Webfoot defenses some concern on Saturday.

The Bruins have scored at least three touchdowns on each of the last four Saturdays and the upcoming clash will pit Oregon's strong defense against the high scoring Uclans.

Civil War ducats going fast at OSC

OREGON STATE COLLEGE—Athletic officials at OSC are constructing bleachers in every available space at Parker Stadium in preparation for the record Homecoming crowd coming for the OSC-Oregon Homecoming game on November 22.

A few hundred reserved seat tickets at \$5 apiece are scattered over the state at various ticket agencies, including OSC Coliseum ticket office, University of Oregon ticket office, J. K. Gill's in Portland and 15 other agencies throughout Oregon and Southwest Washington.

Advance sales for this game have already broken the crowd record of 21,248 who witnessed the OSC-California titanic here on November 1. Parker Stadium can actually seat over 27,000 fans and handle an undetermined number of standing room fans.
