Union okays pull-out

ST. LOUIS (UPI) — The United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners Wednesday passed a resolution authorizing the union to pull out of the AFL-CIO.

The resolution — approved by more than 1,200 of the 2,000 delegates to a convention — charged that AFL-CIO action and policies threaten the union's interest and welfare. The resolution empowers the Carpenters' general executive board to take such action.

James Curley dies

BOSTON (AP) — James Michael Curley, last of the big city political bosses, died Wednesday at City Hospital. He would have been 84 November 20.

Curley was a Democratic leader for more than half a century, serving four terms as mayor of Boston, one term as governor of Massachusetts and four as a congressman.
