So, "for the good of the house," we spend an enormous amount of labor on building something, because we HAVE to. Obviously such an undertaking competes with the academic demands of the University. I think our philosophy is wrong here: If the Canoe Fete is to be continued, then it ought to be continued because those who work recognize that it serves a purpose for the University and because it is a voluntary effort on the part of the individuals and the groups involved.

The elimination and-or modification of these three time-consuming activities, seems to be the next step if we are to follow the example of the Student Union Board. If these functions have real worth, then voluntary planning and participation will perpetuate them. If they can only be perpetuated by required participation, then they must have little real merit and therefore ought to die.
