 "to destroy any nation attacking our country," Secretary of Defense McElroy said Tuesday. He made the statement to newsmen after a three-hour secret conference with the Senate Armed Services Committee to present comparisons of U.S.-Soviet military strength. McElroy added he is confident there will not be a general war because of U.S. ability to "destroy anyone starting it."

NORFOLK, Virginia (UPI)—School officials here said Tuesday they'll move quickly to open the six schools closed last fall when ordered to integrate.

The schools may open in two weeks. A federal court ruled Monday the closings were unconstitutional.

Ike warns of spiral

WASHINGTON (UPI)—President Eisenhower called Tuesday for an intensified fight against inflation.

In his economic message to Congress, Mr. Eisenhower said the nation has snapped back strongly from last year's recession, but he said U.S. economic health is jeopardized by an upward spiral of wages and prices.
