# Huskies pose problem

Oregon's Ducks stepped up drills Tuesday in preparation for their upcoming clash with Washington's rejuvenated cagers Saturday at Seattle.

Coach Tippy Dye's hoopsters, after dropping three of their first four conference clashes, took two wins last weekend to move back into a contending position in the final PCC hoop chase. Washington is presently tied for fourth place with a 3-3 record.

Washington center Doug Smart is currently leading conference scorers with 114 points and a 19 point average per game. Smart will pose a problem to Coach Belko's Webfoots. Smart tallied 19 points against Oregon Friday in Eugene. Smart is also pacing conference rebounders with a percentage of .159 followed by Oregon's Stu Robertson with a .126 rebounding percentage. Robertson is fourth in conference scoring with a 16 point average.

Another problem to Oregon defenses is Bruno Boin. Boin and his hook shot accounted for 16 points against Oregon Friday. Boin has scored 65 points in six conference games for an average of 10.8. Boin is in seventh place for conference rebounding.

The combination of fine shooting by Boin and Smart along with the excellent rebounding of the Huskies will be a problem that Belko and his cagers will have to contend with Saturday.

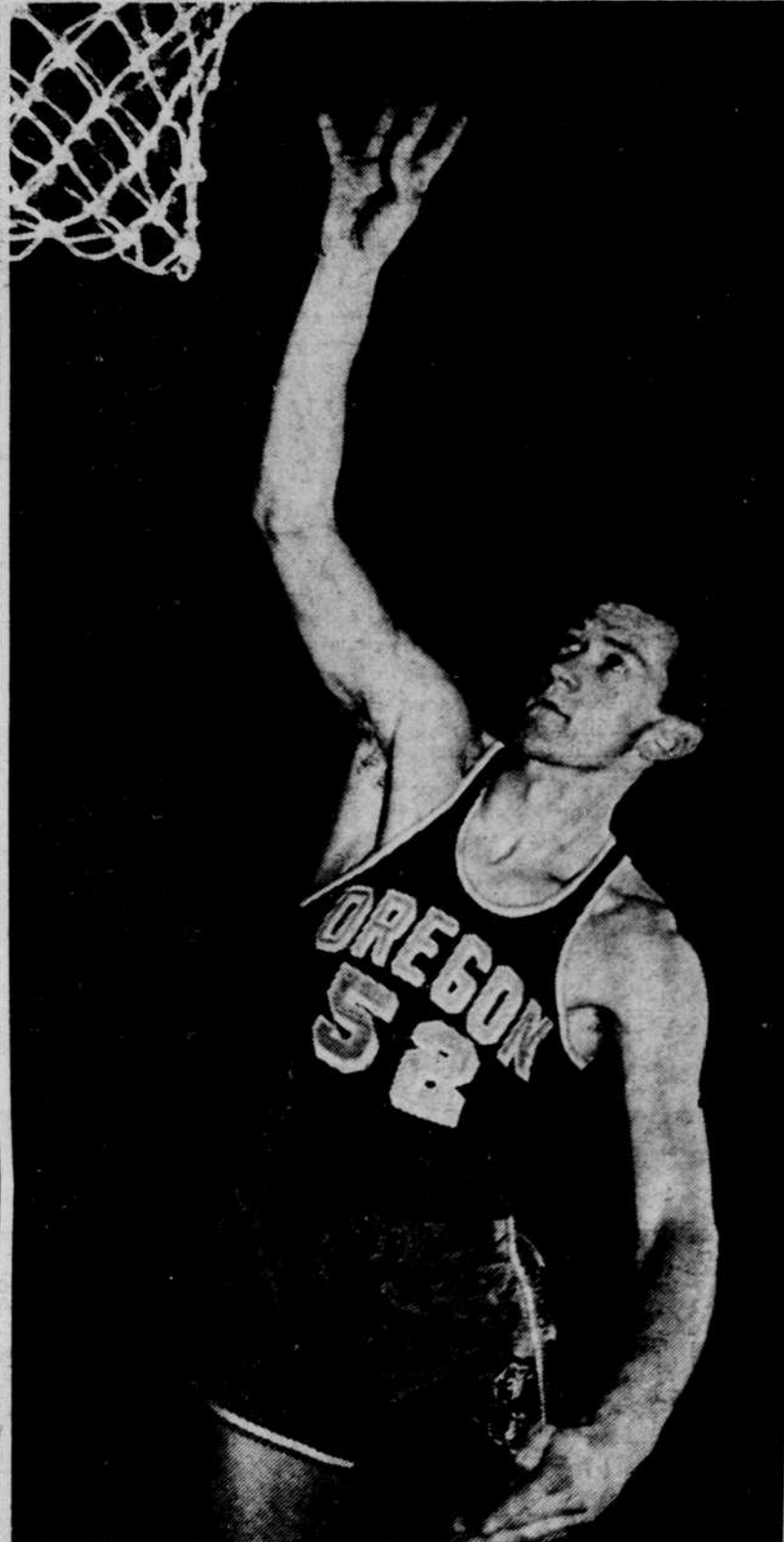
Washington holds a decided statistical advantage over the Webfoots in the latest PCC statistics. The Huskies lead the Ducks in field goals, percentage free throws, total defense, rebounds and field goal defense. Oregon leads in total scoring over the Huskies. Washington leads the conference in field goal percentage with 40.7%.

The Huskies have won 10 and lost six for the entire season and are still the favorites to capture the PCC crown.

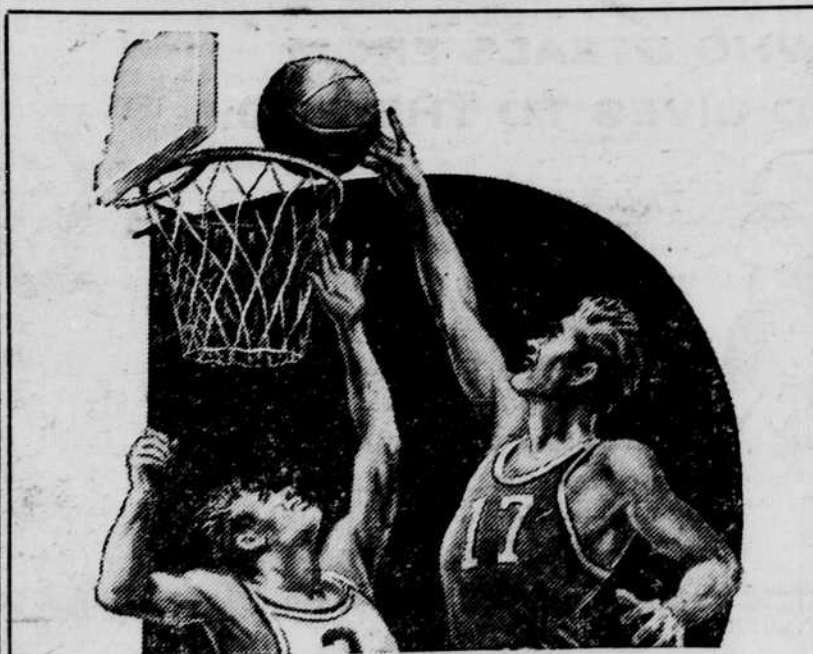
Coach Belko's Webfoots will be seeking revenge in the Saturday clash. The Ducks lost a tight 62-57 game last weekend and will be

attempting to even their conference record at 2-2. The Ducks have won seven and lost five in season action.

Last season the Ducks gained an 87-83 overtime victory against the Washingtonians in Seattle.

## PCC stats released; Smart tops scorers

Washington's Doug Smart leads the Pacific Coast Conference in scoring and rebounding and ranks second in field goal percentage, according to basketball figures released by the PCC Commissioner's office.

The statistics include games through Saturday, January 17, and show Smart atop the scoring column with 49 field goals for 114 points in six games and an average of 19 per contest.

Second is Walt Torrence of UCLA with an 18.4 average with Paul Neumann, Stanford, third, 17.1; Stu Robertson, Oregon, fourth, 16, and Lee Harman, Oregon State, fifth, 14.6.

Smart, the 1958 PCC rebounding champion, has picked off 15.9% of all rebounds in Washington's six games (74 recoveries in 466 opportunities) to take over the top spot from Robertson, who is rebounding at 12.6%, as is Darrell Imhoff of California. Torrence is rebounding at 10.8% while John Liveious of Idaho is fifth at 10.7%.

Only Rafer Johnson of UCLA ranks ahead of Smart in floor shooting. Rafer has scored on 16 of 27 field goal attempts for 59.3%, while Smart has made 49 of 89 tries for 55.1%. Neumann is shooting 51.8%, Robertson 51.2% and Gary Goble, Oregon State, 48.2%.

Jim Woodland of Oregon State is the number one man from the free throw line, having scored on 16 of 17 tries for 94.2%. Neumann is second with 89%, followed by John Werhas, Southern California, 88.2% and Denny Fitzpatrick, California, and George Grant, Washington, both 85.8%.

Others high ranked in scoring include Woodland, sixth, with a 13.6 game average; Fitzpatrick, seventh, 13.7; Werhas, eighth, 13.3; Dick Haga, Stanford, ninth, 12.6, and Chuck Rask, Oregon, tenth, 12.3.

As far as team statistics go,

UCLA is first in the standings with five wins and two losses and leads in scoring with an average of 63.1 points per game. Yet the Bruins have attained these top spots without exceptional shooting, ranking only sixth in free throw accuracy and seventh in field goal percentage. On the backboards it's a different story, however, and they lead the PCC with 52.3%, having recovered 365 rebounds to their opponents 314.

Best shooting team from the floor is Washington with 40.7% (126 field goals in 310 tries) followed by California, 40.3%. From the free throw line, Oregon State continues top-ranked with 77 points in 112 attempts for 68.8%, while Stanford is second at 67.3%.

California has the best defensive record, holding foes to 47.8 points per game, while Stanford has permitted 49.8. USC has the top mark in field goal defense, opponents having been held to a 31.8% floor shot percentage to 33.3% for UCLA.

Southern California is second in scoring with a 59.3 game average, Oregon State is second in rebounding, 51.7%.

The PCC basketball race now goes into two weekends of limited play, due to semester examinations at some schools. Thursday night Oregon State meets Idaho at Moscow, while Friday night the Beavers play Washington State at Pullman.

Oregon and Washington meet Saturday in Seattle to complete the week's schedule.
