

Education conference set for this weekend

The University will host a conference on "The Education of Teachers," sponsored by the Oregon Commission on Teacher Education and Professional Stand-

ards and the Oregon Association for Higher Education, today and Saturday at the SU.

The conference will attract about 250 professional educators and representatives of liberal arts areas from all institutions of higher learning in the state, including approximately 50 representatives of learned societies.

The Oregon conference is to emulate a meeting on teacher-education held last summer at Bowling Green State University in Ohio and sponsored by the National Commission on Teacher Education and Professional Standards, member agency of the National Education Association, in cooperation with seven other educational scientific and learned societies.

• Petitions for Panhellenic Council are due February 20 at 3 p.m. in the AWS petition box in the Student Union.

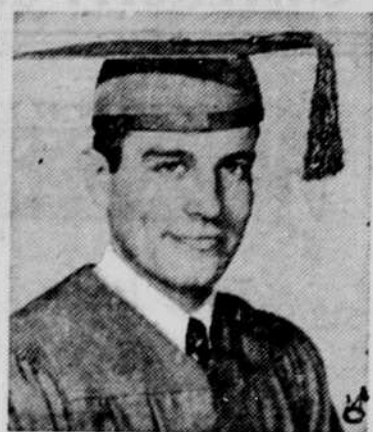
• Offices open are public relations chairman (Eugene girl preferred), scholarship chairman, publicity chairman, standards chairman, social and activities chairman, and member at large.
