

Webfoots at California, Stanford

Coach Steve Belko and his Webfoot cage squad left Thursday for this weekend's battles with California and Stanford.

The Ducks will be attempting to keep alive their two-game winning streak as well as trying to improve on their 3-5 PCC record.

California, currently leading the conference race, needs a win over the Ducks to maintain its position, as the Washington Huskies are only a half-game behind the Bears.

The Stanford cage squad needs a win over the Oregonians in order to remain in title contention.

The Ducks met both clubs earlier in the season and defeated California 59-57 and lost 65-57 to Stanford. Coach Belko's squad has a two-game winning streak going against Pete Newell's Cal squad, as they dumped the Bears 64-62 in Berkeley last season along with this season's victory.

The Cal-Oregon series has been characterized by many thrilling contests and tonight's game should prove no exception. The last three games between the two squads have been decided by two points or less.

In tonight's clash with the league-leading Bears the Webfoots face two problems; Cal has the top defensive team in the conference and also paces the PCC in rebounding.

The Ducks are in eighth place in the rebounding and third in total defense.

The Bears are aiming for their third consecutive PCC title and the big guns in the Cal attack thus far are 6-0 guard Denny Fitzpatrick and 6-10 Darrell Imhoff.

Fitzpatrick is leading the Bears scoring attack with 204 points for a 12 point average per game.

Imhoff is second in team scoring and tops the Bears in rebounding. The big 6-10 cager is the fourth best rebounder.

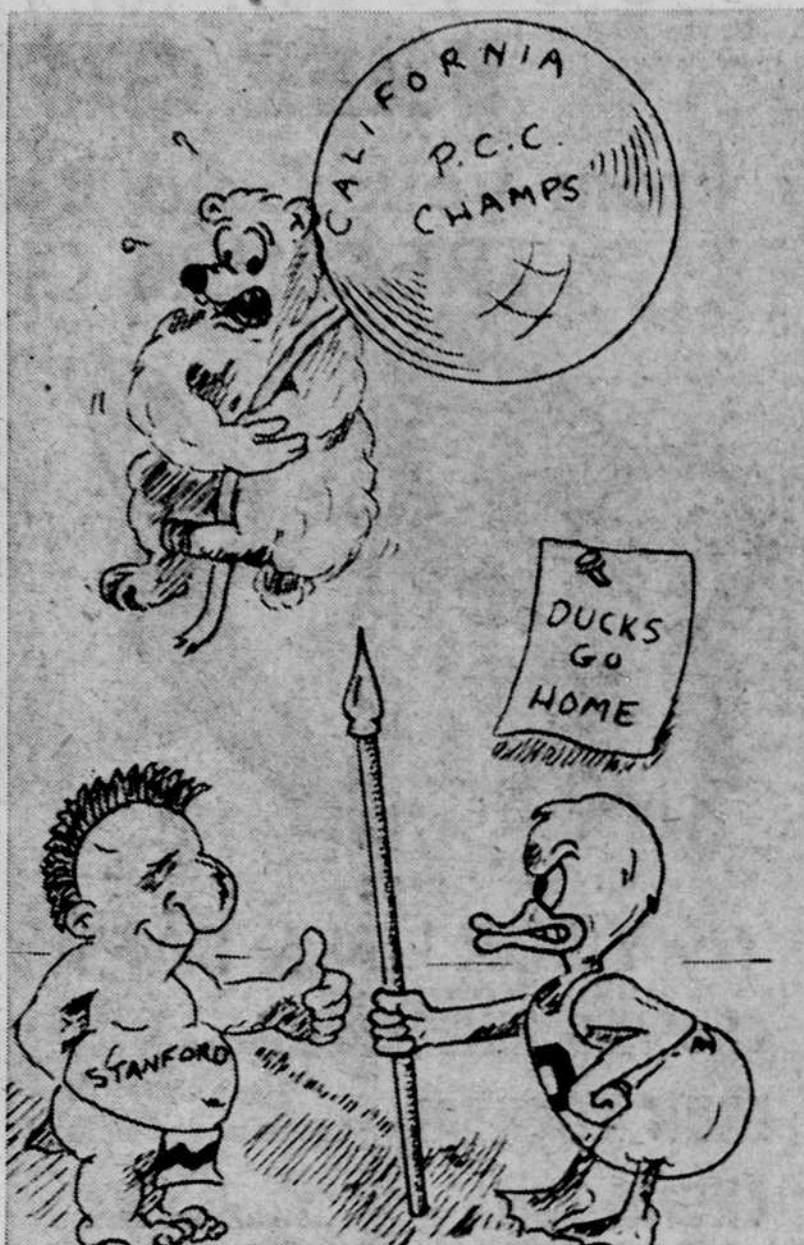
Probable starting lineup for coach Newell's Bears is Bob Dalton and Bill McClintock at forwards, Imhoff at the pivot spot and Fitzpatrick and Al Buch at guards.

The Bears holding a decided statistical advantage over the Ducks and Oregon holds a margin over the Bears in free throw shooting for its only statistical edge.

The Ducks will hope for a more consistent attack in the contest with Stanford.

Oregon lost a 65-57 decision to coach Howie Dallmar's Indians earlier in the season. The Ducks held a 27-23 halftime lead over Stanford but the attack went cold in the second half and Oregon dropped its sixteenth decision in 17 starts in all-time conference competition with Stanford.

a problem for Oregon. The cagers from Palo Alto are second in conference defense, but last in total scoring.

Coach Belko's lads will have to stop high-scoring guard Paul Neumann Saturday in order to emerge victorious against the defense-minded Indians.

Neumann is currently in fourth spot in PCC individual scoring with a 16 point average.

The Indians hold a statistical edge over the Webfoots by leading Oregon in field goals, free throws, total defense, and field goal defense. The Ducks lead Stanford in total scoring and rebounding.

Oregon is expected to start Dale Herron, Stu Robertson and Denny Strickland in the front line with Chuck Rask and Bud Kuykendall at guards.

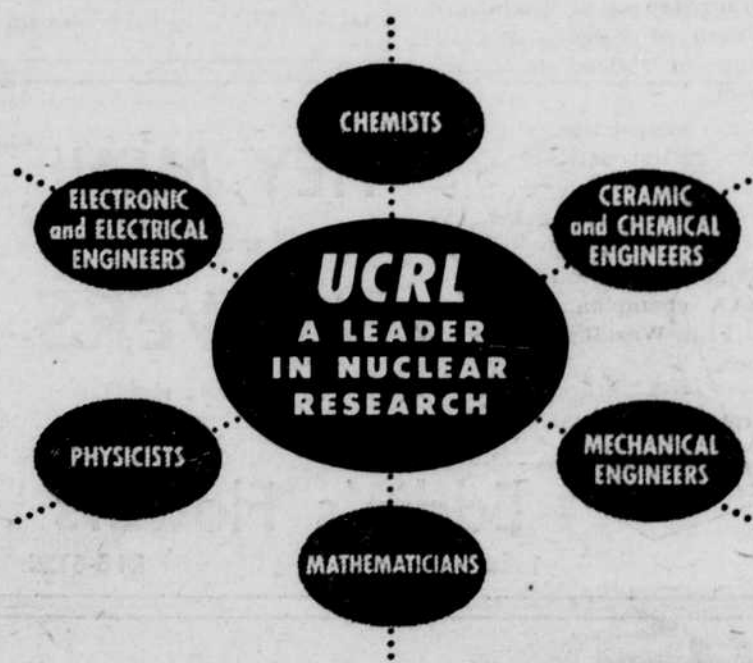
