Oregon bowlers eye NW tourney on SU allies

The Northwest Regional games will be held at the Student Union Thursday through Saturday, April 23-25 according to tournament director Lou Bellissimo.

Competition for the schools in the Association of College Unions will begin Thursday with the first team series in bowling slated to begin at 8 p.m.

Twenty schools will compete in the tournament which will include competition in bowling, billiards and table tennis.

Doubles and singles in bowling are scheduled to get underway Saturday morning at 9. Times have not as yet been set for billiards and table tennis.

Trophies for the three-day tournament will be awarded at 1 p.m. Saturday in the Student Union.

Schools competing in addition to Oregon are Southern Oregon College of Education, OSC, Lewis and Clark, Seattle University, University of Washington, Central Washington College of Education, Eastern Washington College of Education, Pacific University, Nevada, Olympic Junior College, Yakima Valley Junior College, Montana State University, Gonzaga, Western Washington College of Education, Idaho, Washington State, Idaho State, Montana State College and Portland State.

Duck golfers top country clubbers

Sid Milligan's Oregon golf squad scored a 12-6 victory over the Columbia Edgewater all-stars at the Portland course Sunday.

The victory, Oregon's fifth during the current campaign, kept the Ducks' undefeated 1959 dual meet record intact.

Keith Gubrud paced the victors with a 70, nipping Columbia's Bob Atkinson by one stroke.

The Ducks will be out to upend the Washington Staters. Coach Don Kirsch's Webfoots ended Oregon State's 15 game winning streak last Saturday and will be out to dampen the title hopes of WSC as well as enhance their hopes of capturing the title.

Washington State and Oregon are currently tied with two other squads for the loop lead with 1-1 records.

Oregon has a 12-7 season record as compared to WSC's ten wins and 9 losses.

Bailey's squad has been a good pitch, no hit club so far this season.

Coach Bailey is trying to bolster his light hitting outfield by switching pitcher Bob Bolingbroke into center field. Bolingbroke hit .318 in preseason play and hit four home runs.

Arnold Pleasant, WSC third baseman led the Cougar batting attack with a .411 average during the preseason campaign.

Top pitchers for WSC are Dick

Montee, Bolingbroke, Boyd Swent and Elwood Hahn.

Montee led the Cougar mound staff in early games with a 4-1 record and a 2.39 earned run average.

The games are slated to begin at 3 p.m. both Wednesday and Thursday.
