## Gridders kick off spring practice



**RETURNING FULLBACK** Dave Powell is one of Oregon's top returnees this spring football practice. The hard-charging fullback, only a junior, pushed his way into the starting lineup late in the 1958 campaign and is expected to shine this season.

Spring football practice got underway Monday with more than 60 gridgers turning out for the 20-day drills.

Coach Len Casanova, who will be entering his ninth year as Webfoot grid mentor, will be seeking to find replacements for the graduating linemen from last season's defense-minded squad.

The Webfoots lost guard Bob Grottkau, tackles Jim Linden and Darrell Aschbacher, guard Joe Schaffeld and ends Pete Welch and Ron Stover from the starting line of the 1958 season.

Reserve linemen Dave Fish, Bob Heard and Will Reeve also will not be on hand for the upcoming fall campaign.

Leading the list of returning lettermen are All-Coast center Bob Peterson and All-Coast halfback Willie West.

Returning for another campaign in the backfield are Dave Grosz at quarterback, West, Dave Powell at fullback, Dave Grayson and Don Laudenslager at halfbacks, Harry Needham at fullback and Sandy Fraser

at quarterback.

The addition of JC transfers and members of the unbeaten freshman squad turned out for spring drills yesterday and are expected to bolster Duck grid fortunes for the 1959 campaign.

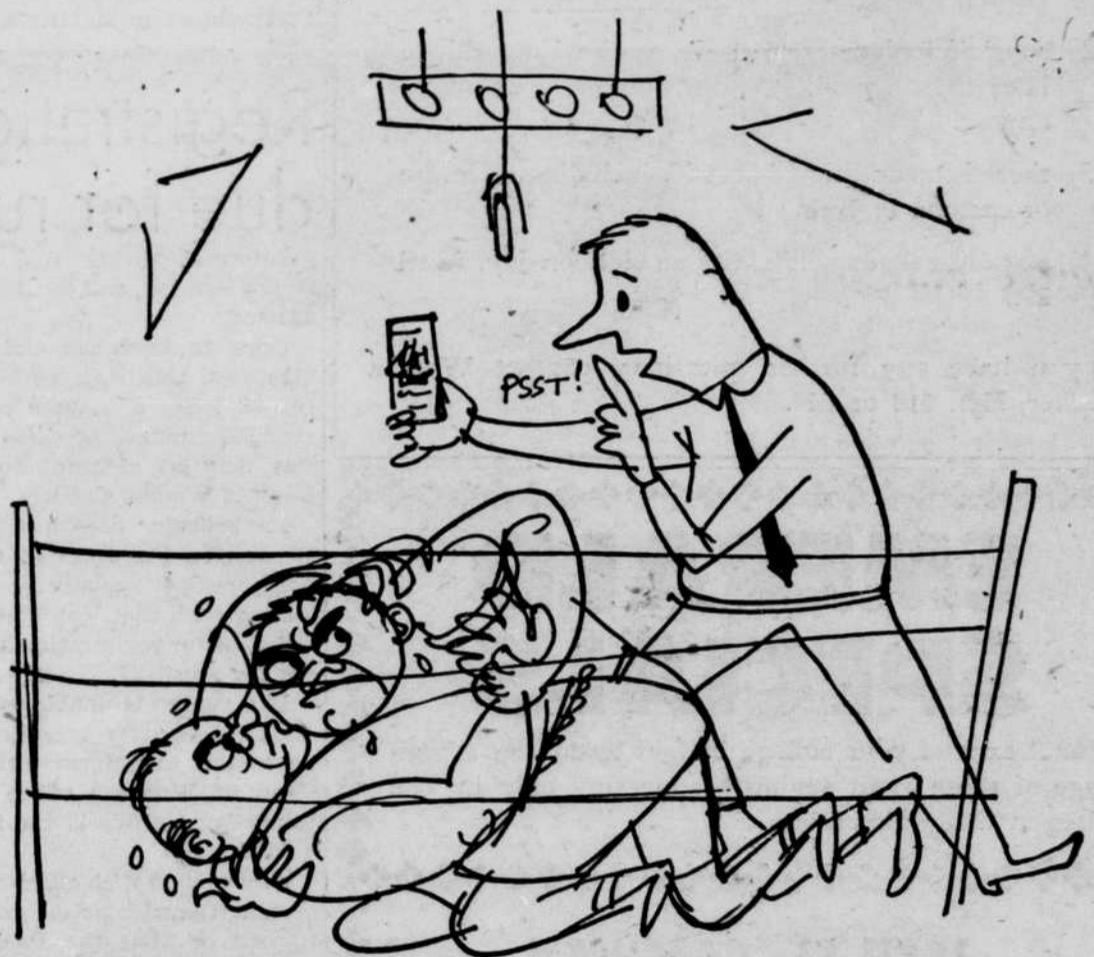
