Belgian geologist to speak tonight

John Verhoogen, onetime chief prospector of the Kilo-Moto Gold mine in the Belgian Congo and professor of geology at the University of California, will speak on "Temperatures Within the Earth" tonight at 8 p.m. in Science 16.

Verhoogen, a native of Belgium, is sponsored by the American Geologic Institute as the Sigma Xi lecturer. He will be at the University through Wednesday.

Verhoogen was graduated from the University of Brussels in Belgium in 1933 and received his Ph.D. in volcanology from Stanford University in 1936. He spent six years in Africa first with the Kilo-Moto Gold Mines and later as an engineer for the Belgian Congo government.

• There will be a scholarship meeting for all girls below a 2. last term or a 2. accumulative in the SU at 4 p.m. on Thursday.

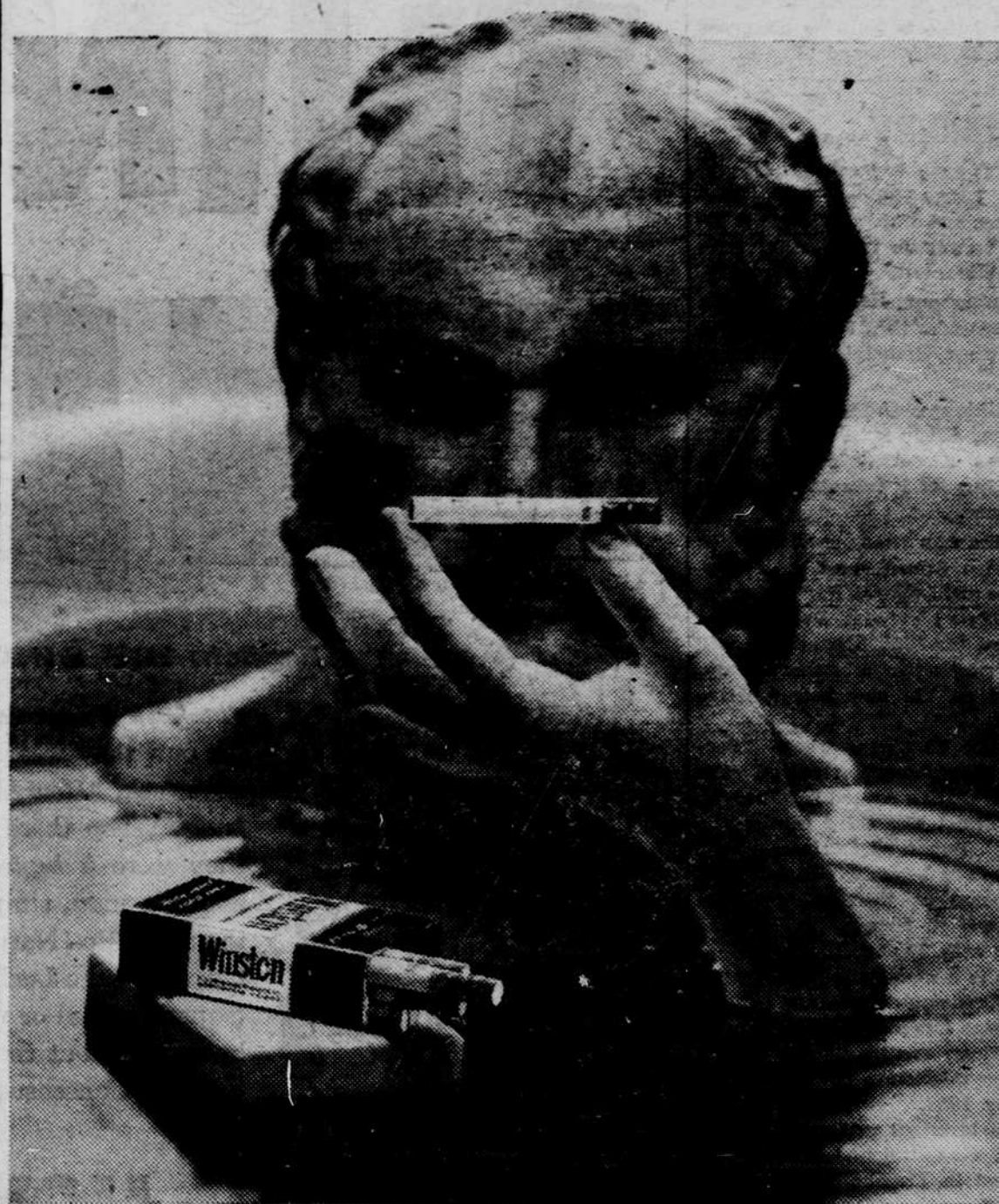
