

Beta, Sigma Chi, DU advance to IM semis

In Monday's first round of intramural playoffs, there were four hard fought games, with the largest margin of victory being only eight points.

Delta Upsilon kept its winning streak intact by squeaking by Hale Kane in one of the closest games in IM action this year.

In other action, Beta Theta Pi hobbled Young Hall in a tight defensive game 8-0.

Sigma Alpha Mu pulled off a minor upset by scoring a 6-0 victory over a tough Lambda Chi team.

In the final action of the afternoon, the vaunted Sigma Chi attack sputtered, but was able to pick up enough steam to beat a rough Counselors team 12-8.

As a result of Monday's action, Beta will play Sigma Chi for a championship berth today at 4:00. In the only other game today, Sheldon will play SAM. The winner of this game will play Delta Upsilon on Wednesday.

SAM victors

Sigma Alpha Mu beat Lambda Chi Alpha 6-0 behind the passing of Gil Olman. SAM had been outplayed most of the game by the LCAs, but, in the third quarter, Dave Rogoway intercepted a Glen Tillitt pass to set up the lone SAM touchdown.

Olman passed to Bob Coblens for the score. Gary Rosenthal and Neil Goldschmidt were both instrumental in the SAM win, making several fine catches of Olman's passes.

Lambda Chi suffered when Dave Sanborn, their best left end, was hurt in the first quarter. Tillitt passed well to John Holloway and Clyde Stephenson, but couldn't generate enough power to score.

Beta scores

Beta Theta Pi slid by Young Hall in another rough defensive game. The high scoring Betas were held to only one touchdown by the tough Young defense.

Beta got its only score on a pass from Al Mills to Nick Utt, good for 20 yards. The score came on a fourth down late in the second quarter, after a determined goal line stand by Young.

Pierce Brownell was passing well for Young, but several goal line stands by the Betas kept Young scoreless. Late in the game Brownell completed several long passes to Jackson but time ran out.

Hugh Springer and Mac Carmichael stood out well offensively for the Betas and Berkley Holman played a stellar game at defensive end.

DU in overtime

In a hard fought game, DU beat Hale Kane in an overtime by racking up 15 yards to Hale Kane's 0. The game ended in an 8-8 tie with each team having 4 first downs.

Nick Pereira's passing to Larry Slessler set up many scoring opportunities for the DU's but George Kahanu and Jim Moriarity did a fine defensive job in holding the DU scoring down.

All the scoring was done in the first half. Hale Kane scored first on a pass from Paul Ganley to Henry Furukido. Another pass from Ganley to Furukido gave HK two extra points.

After the Hale Kane TD the DU's started a scoring drive with Pereira's passes to Slessler eating up the yardage. Hale Kane stopped DU, however, and took over on first downs. Then a series of three straight interceptions interrupted the action.

First, Joe McFarland intercepted Ganley's long pass, and on the very next play, George Kahanu got the ball back for Hale Kane by grabbing Disque Lunceford's throw.

The ball again switched hands when Gary Wilson stole a Hale Kane pass.

This proved to be disastrous for Hale Kane as, on the very next play, Pereira passed to Bob Saunders for the DU score. Pereira ran the conversion.

The second half was strictly a defensive battle. In the last quarter, several tempers flared and players from both sides were temporarily ejected from the game.

Lunceford and Wilson were both outstanding in the DU victory. Wilson made a total of three interceptions for DU.

Sigma Chi wins

In the top game of the afternoon, Sigma Chi ground out a 12-8 win over an unexpectedly tough Counselor team.

There was no scoring in the first quarter, but late in the second quarter a 40 yard pass from quarterback John Schwartz to Denny Conlon set up the first Sigma Chi score.

Schwartz ran two plays to the right, and finally scored on a sweep to the left.

Don Gottesman's passes were clicking to Kent Dorwin but the big Sigma Chi defense stopped all Counselor scoring threats in the first half.

In the second half, Jim Josephson's fine offensive blocking led the way to another Sigma Chi score. The touchdown came in the third quarter on a pass from Schwartz to Dick Miller.

In an effort to get back into the game, the Counselors resorted to a passing attack in the fourth quarter. However, the increasing darkness and an unceasing Sigma Chi defense held the Counselors to only one touchdown. The score was on a 60-yard pass from Gottesman to Fent Lockenauer. Gottesman ran the conversion for the extra two points.

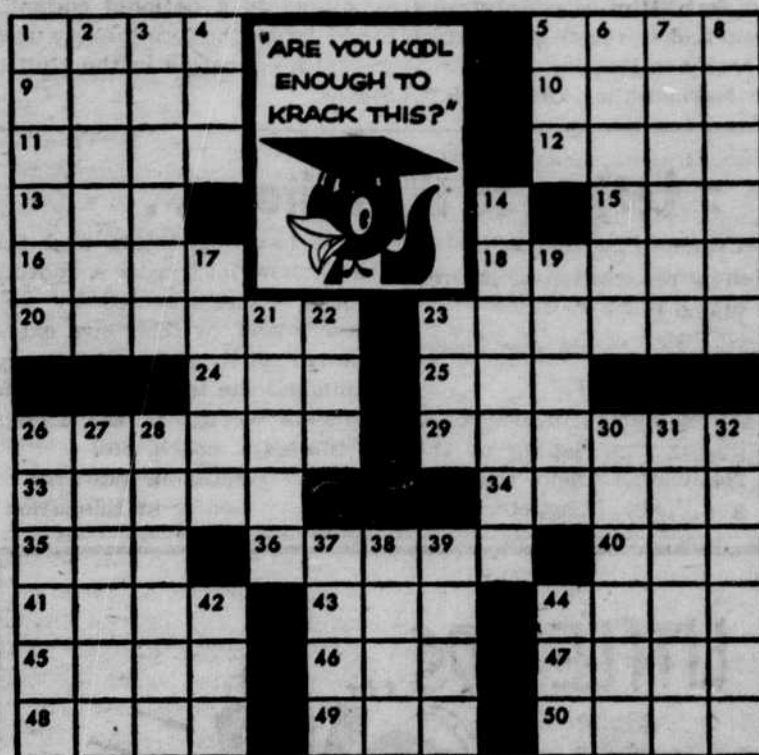
