or violence. It is clear, he wrote, that such persons are not entitled to nor should not receive funds from the United States Government.

Fleming then pointed out that the requirement will not uncover any such persons, since "Such persons have no scruples about signing such an affidavit and taking such an oath."

His final point is that "The inclusion of this requirement singles out educators and students for special treatment without making a contribution to national safety."

Senate recommends that Review continue

ASUO Senate approved a report on the Northwest Review Thursday night which recommended that the Review continue to be published because of its "considerable quality."

Submitted by Steve Hintz, senator-at-large, the report was drawn up by a committee of Mike Hollister, Jim Lynch, Margaret Reedy, and faculty members John Hulteng, associate professor of journalism; E. R. Bingham, associate professor of English, and Sylvan Karchmer, chairman of the Student Publications Board.

The Review was commended for its considerable advancement toward filling a "cultural void" in the Northwest since its establishment three years ago and for its good reputation in literary circles.

Passed unanimously, the report recommended that the Review strive to include more student work and more work oriented to the Northwest area.

The report also recommended that the ASUO Senate review the magazine in four years.

THE UNIVERSITY faculty, in April, unanimously passed the resolution of protest, which was transmitted to Secretary Fleming and other key persons by President Wilson.

The disclaimer affidavit requirement, as well as a loyalty oath (which is not protested by the faculty), is part of the provisions under which all persons receive funds from the National Defense Education Act (this includes loans to undergraduates and grants to graduate students).

Under the disclaimer affidavit all fund recipients swear that they do not seek, nor do they belong to any organization which believes in or teaches, overthrow of the government by force or violence.
