

Homecoming 'best yet' chairman forecasts

"Homecoming '60 promises to be one of the best ever at Oregon," reported Homecoming chairman, Patti Claggett. In a meeting with the Homecoming committee chairman Tuesday noon, the events scheduled for this weekend of October 14-16 were discussed.

THERE will be a concert given by Roger Williams. Buddy Morrow and his "Night Train" orchestra will be featured at the Homecoming dance.

This year University will play the Washington State Cougars for the last home game of the season.

LAST YEAR the "V"-Show established itself as a tradition of

Homecoming. Roger Gross has written the script for an original musical comedy which will run three different nights. The theme is "The Trouble With College Men."

The rally-music parade chairman, Bob Warr, stated that this year's parade would be based on new and original ideas. As in the past the parade will lead to the bonfire at Hayward Field where the Homecoming queen will be announced.

TWO LUNCHEONS are scheduled for the weekend, one luncheon for all returning Oregon Alums and the second for the class of '55, which is holding its first reunion.

1961 Organa will be sold only during fall registration

The 1961 Organa will be sold only during fall term registration, Jay Jackson, business manager of the yearbook, emphasized today. Cost of the book, which will be published in four volumes, is \$6.80, the same price as last year's traditional annual.

Students must return the publications card which they received with the registration material whether or not they purchase an Organa. Cards will be collected at the Organa table in the Student Union Ballroom during registration.

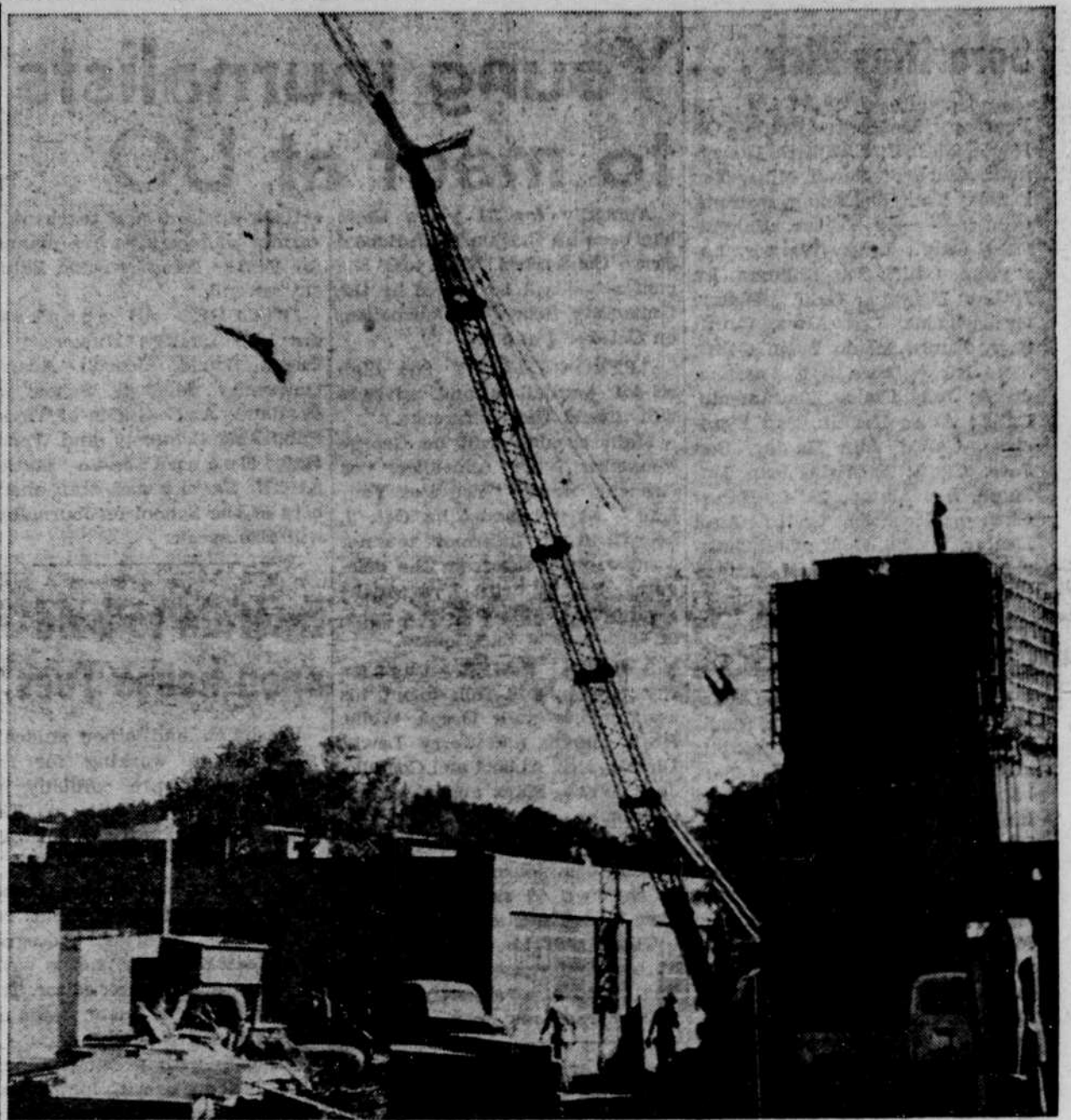
Each volume will be hard-bound and contain over 100 pages, according to Dwane McHolick, editor.

"We feel that the new format will provide more complete coverage of campus events and offer greater opportunities for experimentation in presentation of the material," McHolick said, add-

ing that he hopes to make the 1961 Organa more representative of the year's activities and University campus than past annuals.

First volume, to be distributed early in winter term, will include fall events, football, publications, administration, and academic sections.

Housing and winter term books will be published during spring term, and the spring volume, which will cover commencement and include seniors' pictures, can be mailed to students.
