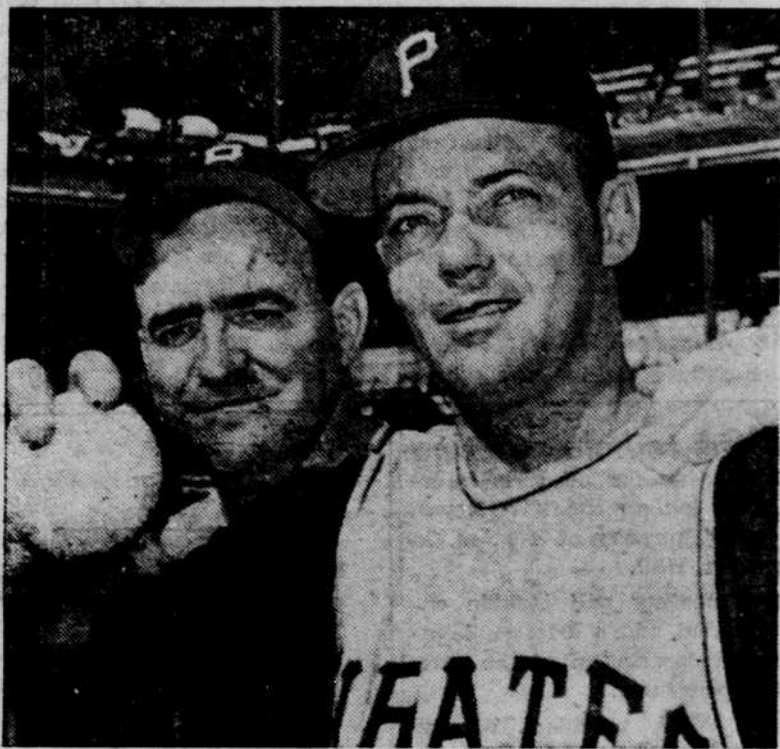

Pirates shelled, 12-0

The New York Yankees thundered back into the role as favorites in the 1960 World Series on the wings of a 12-0 pasting of the Pittsburgh Pirates yesterday in Pittsburgh.

THE YANKEES wasted little time in getting things under control.

They piled up a 6-0 lead by the third inning and coasted on from there, adding two runs each in the sixth, seventh, and eighth inning.

The win knotted the series a 3-3, and the Yanks made it look easy.

In all, they collected 17 hits to the Pirate's seven, as veteran Whitey Ford coasted to his seventh World Series victory in sunny 85 degree weather.

There were plenty of slugging heroes in the Yankee lineup, as every New York regular got at least one hit.

PROBABLY the biggest Yankee sticker was little Bobby Richardson. The New York second sacker continued his hitting rampage with two for five and three runs batted in.

Richardson's three RBI's looked all the more remarkable against his regular season total of 26. His three yesterday gave him 12 RBIs for the series, a new record.

Richardson had plenty of company in the hitting department.

Yogi Berra, whose series RBI record Richardson broke, collected three for four at the plate himself and had two runs batted in.

Bill Skowron picked up two for four at the plate and Micky Mantle had two RBIs. So did pitcher Whitey Ford.

The Yanks now rate as 6-5 Series favorites off their strong Wednesday performance.

PITTSBURGH manager, Danny Murtaugh said he would start Vern Law, as expected. Yankee manager Casey Stengel was uncommitted.

The Yanks did suffer one loss in yesterday's otherwise bright afternoon.

Front line catcher Elston Howard suffered a fractured right hand when struck by a pitch in the second inning. He is definitely out.

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Don Kasso out; Terry Baker to start for OSC

The Oregon State Beavers try to make their record four wins and one loss this coming Saturday with a sophomore starting at the key tailback spot.

Heralded Terry Baker, a high school All-American at Jefferson high of Portland will replace brilliant junior, Don Kasso, in the all important tailback slot.

Kasso has gained 338 yards from running and passing so far this year. Duck fans undoubtedly remember him well for his outstanding play in the homecoming game at Hayward field last year.

BAKER, HOWEVER, is an able replacement. He is a rarity in college football, a true triple threat. Like Kasso, he has gained over five yards every time he has carried the ball. He has completed 18 out of 30 aeriels for 236 yards and a pair of touchdowns. He is averaging 43 yards on his punts.

In fact, if Baker continued at his present rate, he would be within 14 yards of the all-time OSC total offense record, now held by Joe Francis, garnered in his senior season.

IT LOOKS AS IF the Ducks will have their hands full come November 19 when they journey to Corvallis for the annual civil war clash. If Kasso is also ready at that time, it could be a real battle.

Also out for the contest with the Vandals are guard Norby Keolanui and Roger Johnson, end.

Three newcomers top NCAA stats

Three new players took over the leaderships in rushing, passing and total offense according to NCAA statistics released yesterday.

THE NEW total offensive leader after four week ends of competition is Howie Dyer, a senior at Virginia Military Institute, who moved ahead of Iowa State sophomore Dave Hoppmann, the leader during the first weeks of competition.

Hoppmann was injured last week end and dropped his leadership in both total offense and in rushing. Hoppmann is now ninth in total offense.

Bobby Gaiters of New Mexico State took over the leadership in rushing offense from the Iowa State sophomore. Gaiters has racked up a total of 552 yards in 72 rushing attempts.

OREGON'S Dave Grayson is tenth in rushing.

Washington State's Keith Lincoln, who will face the Ducks this Saturday at Hayward Field, is eight in the nation in the rushing department.

Lincoln's teammate, quarter-

back Mel Melin, ranks behind VMI's Dyer in total offense with 709 yards on 113 plays.

Dyers' leading total is 722 yards on 116 plays.

In the passing department, the Air Force Academy's Richie Mayo has moved into the lead after four weeks of competition with 54 completions in 99 attempts for 504 yards.

ACTUALLY THE senior from Eureka, California, is tied in number of completions with Johnny Furman of Texas Western. Furman has gained 591 yards.

Mayo gets the nod in leadership however, on the basis of a .545 completion mark. Furman has a .479 average in passing.

In punting, Bob Fitzsimmons of Denver University is leading the country with a 52.4 average on nine boots.

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
