Oregon's promising Frosh football team opens its season today on Hayward field at 1:30 p.m. against the WSU Couababes. Sporting a high school star at almost every position, the Ducklings run into an unknown quantity in the Couababe team.

In the same situation last year, the highly heralded Frosh squad from Oregon got dumped, and dumped hard on frozen turf in Pullman. This year, however, the Ducks have Mel Renfro, and a fine array of outstanding backfield tal-

ent, notably lacking on last year's team, as only Duane Cargill is now playing on the varsity from that group.

Renfro, one of Oregon's all-time high school greats, comes from Jefferson of Portland, and was not only an all-state selection both his junior and senior year, but was voted the most valuable player in last year's state Shrine football game, following Terry Baker, present Oregon State tailback, in that capacity.

New freshman coach, John Robinson said in sizing up the squad, "We'll just wait and see how they perform. They are unproven as of now."

Robinson replaced Brad Ecklund who joined with the new Dallas coaching staff in the National Football League. The new Duckling coach was assistant under Ecklund for two years, and played on the Webfoot Rose Bowl team of 1957-58.

The Duckling team will have a pair of Californians going at ends, Dick Imwalle, from San Jose, and Dick Schwab of San Diego. Both are 195 pounders.

The team will have plenty of beef at tackle with Dennis Maloney, a 227 pounder from Cleveland of Portland, and Mike Stroginnis, from San Diego, another of the many California players in the line-up.

At guard, Robinson will probably start Phil Cooper from San Diego, and Ron Jones of North Salem. Pushing them hard for positions will be Bob Keeney and Gene Brodsky.

At center it is a battle between Larry Horyna from Ontario, Oregon and Ron Stratten of San Francisco. Horyna, who is co-captain with starting quarterback, Bill Berry, will most likely get the nod.

Berry, who according to reports from practice scrimmages throws real well from the key passing, has a pair of top men right behind him in Doug Post of Oroville, California, and Max Chobian of Tulare, California.

With three senior quarterbacks graduating next year from the Duck varsity, the performance

of these three frosh could be important to future Duck teams, and they will all have possible shots at the starting line-up next year.

Besides Renfro, the other starting halfback will be Monty Fitchett of Kelso, Washington. Larry Hill of Astoria, and Dick Shanley from Coos Bay may also see action.

At fullback the biggest fight for a starting position is being waged between Luscious Bain of Fort Vancouver, Washington, shifted from his high school halfback spot, Bill Youngmayer of North Bend, and Bob Good of Canada who has an outside chance.

The Couababes will be slightly outweighed by the Frosh, but could be faster in the line.

Only one Oregonian will be on the Couababe starting eleven. He is end Bill Cook from Pendleton.

With Jim Sutherland's WSU teams having primarily passing offenses, fans can look for the air to be filled with footballs, many of which fly from the hand of quarterback Gary Pence.

The Ducklings have a four game schedule this year, including tilts with the OSC Rooks, October 27 in Portland and November 18 in Eugene, plus a game with the Washington Frosh in Seattle, November 11.

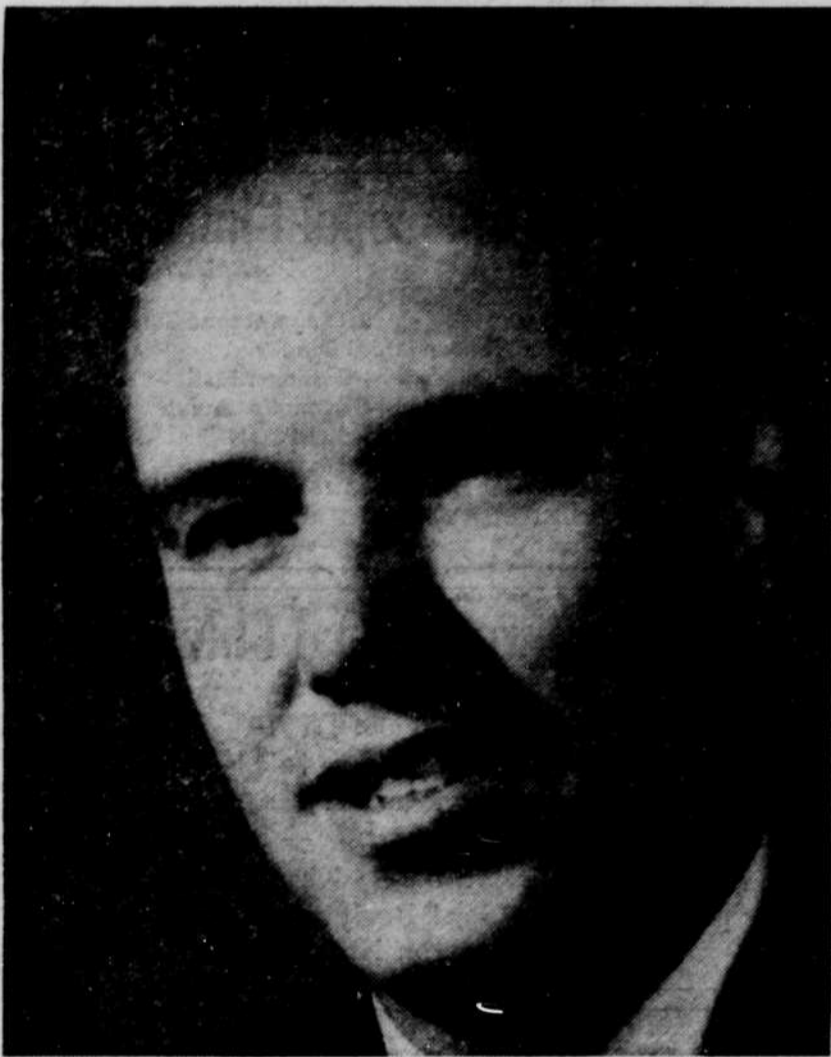
