

Improving West Virginia to test Ducks

Two teams occupying extremes on the football ladder, West Virginia's winless Mountaineers, and Oregon's winning Ducks (6-2), collide tomorrow afternoon in what should be an interesting ball game for all sides.

FOR THE Mountaineers of Gene Corum, it will be the next-to-last chance to gain victory number one for this season. The Mounties are currently 0-6-2 but almost climbed aboard the victory wagon last week end before being Boston U., 7-7, and will be more desperate than ever against the Webfoots tomorrow in Portland.

Len Casanova on the other hand, has the job of keeping his ducks up for the lowly West Virginians, in the face of next week end's very important clash with arch rival Oregon State. Nevertheless, this should be

one of the exciting ball games of the season for the two clubs, and the Ducks can by no means be considered sure bets to win at this stage.

WEST VIRGINIA is a young football team that carries a travelling squad of 37 men, 23 of whom are experienced sophomores who have handled the brunt of the attack in Coach Corum's platooning offense.

Portland fans at Multnomah Stadium Saturday will see an interesting brand of wing-T football played by the easterners. It will be similar in some ways to the California wing-T attack the Ducks turned back earlier in the season, but will employ more variation.

Chief threats in the Mountaineer offense should be junior Dale Evans, a crafty option runner and WVU's leading passer in several years, and Don Myers,

the team's biggest ground gainer this year with a 4.6 average.

THE OREGON attack suffered two blows yesterday when it was learned that two ailing first stringers, guard Mike Rose, and fullback Bruce Snyder may not play in the West Virginia game. Rose was out of action in last week's 27-6 victory over Stanford and Snyder, the rapidly improving junior fullback was injured during the Stanford game and has been out of practice most of this week.
