Two of the Americans were stabbed in the incident, which took place in Leopoldville.

AUGUSTA, Georgia (UPI) — President Eisenhower has accepted the resignation of US ambassador to Italy, James Zellerbach.

Ambassador Zellerbach, US spokesman in Rome for nearly four years, says he wants to return to private life.
