Basketball, track-and-field, and motion pictures headline this wonderful weekend's entertainment activities.

Oregon's varsity basketball team returns to Mac Court for a two-night series with Stanford University. The frosh basketball squad will play preliminary games both nights, at 6 p.m. Tonight the Ducklings tangle with the Oregon College JV's, and tomorrow night with the Sweet Home AAU.

AFTER THE ball game is over, a Fishbowl Mixer has been scheduled for tonight, at 9:00, and a Bottom of the Bowl for tomorrow night.

Immediately following tonight's basketball game, the varsity wrestling squad will take on the University of Utah, in Mac Court. Following tomorrow night's basketball game, about 9:30, the varsity wrestlers have it out with Washington State. Tomorrow afternoon, at 2:00, the frosh wrestle Lower Columbia JC.

A crack field of world record holders, Olympic Games champions and top-flight collegians will open the 1961 indoor track season at the Memorial Coliseum, tomorrow night, at 8:00, in Portland. Tickets are on sale in Eugene at Mattox Pipe Shop.

"A FEVER IN the Blood" opens tonight at the McDonald Theatre. The film, from the novel on honest and dishonest politics by William Pearson, stars Efrem Zimbalist Jr., Angie Dickinson, Jack Kelly, Don Ameche, Ray Danton, Herbert Marshall and Andra Martin. Co-featured is "Why Must I Die?"

A comedy dealing with a slightly unusual marital situation, "Marriage-Go-Round," is the feature film fare at the Fox Theatre. Susan Hayward, James Mason and Katrin Sveig star.

On the same bill, at the Fox, is "Desire in the Dust." Featuring Raymond Burr, Martha Hyer, Joan Bennett and Ken Scott, the film traces the story of an unjustly convicted man who returns to his hometown to resume life as he knew it.

DOLORES HART and Connie Francis play the lead roles along with George Hamilton in "Where the Boys Are" at the Heilig Theatre. Also on the same program is "Key Witness."

Closer to the campus, the Mayflower Theatre is currently running Ingemar Bergman's "A Les-

son in Love," and "The Little Hut," starring Ava Gardner.

Local high school basketball has several top-flight games on tap for this weekend.

LEAGUE-LEADING South Eugene, which is shaping-up as the team to beat for the state title, plays host to North Bend, also with a 2-0 league record, tonight, at 8:00, and then travels to North Eugene for the cross-town civil war game, tomorrow night.

Marshfield plays at Willamette, tonight, while North Eugene is at Thurston (of Springfield). Springfield is idle.

Elmira travels to Pleasant Hill and Drain to McKenzie in the feature Emerald League games. St. Francis, defending state A-2 champion, is at Junction City and Oakridge at Central Linn.

TOMORROW night, Willamette journeys to North Bend, Thurston to Cottage Grove and Springfield to Marshfield.

In the Emerald League, McKenzie hosts Central Linn in the only game scheduled.
