Many 'live' plays due for weekend

"Live" theater fans should enjoy this week-end—three plays are being presented in the area.

UNIVERSITY Theater's first production of the season, Christopher Fry's "The Lady's Not for Burning," will open Friday night. The play is scheduled for Oct. 14, 19, 20, and 21. Curtain time is 8 p.m.; admission \$1.00.

The Very Little Theater will conclude "Life With Father" this week-end. For reservation, call DI 4-7751. Admission is \$1.00 and curtain time is 8:15.

THE CHRISTIAN Drama Troup is giving two performances of Henri Gheon's, "The Comedian," at 7:30 Saturday and Sunday nights at the Allison Park Christian Church. The public is invited to attend.

Dixieland and Jazz will be heard Saturday night at the Lane County Fairgrounds. The Eugene all-stars, who are currently appearing at the King Cole room, will play for "your listening and dancing pleasure." They are a fun group and certainly make enjoyable music. You might even get more of a kick out of them than the music.

IF DRAMA and jazz isn't your idea of a good time, you can always go to the movies, although this week-end is a little less than spectacular.

The Mayflower is showing "Not Tonight Henry," one of the more famous of the recent rush of "nudie" films. Its fame is due largely to the fact that it was a replacement for the denounced "The Lovers," which was briefly shown in Portland. Which film is actually worse is anybody's guess, although I think "Not Tonight" might be. At least the other had a semblance of plot; this just has a semblance of girls.

"**FRANCIS OF ASSISI**," with Delores Hart and Bradford Dillman, is on at the McDonald. This is a study in faith with some inspiring moments but may be too long and too slow for good entertainment.

The Fox is showing Walt Disney's "Grayfriars Bobby," a story of a dog, and "Tiger Bay," the story of a young girl who befriends a sailor suspected of murder. Hayley Mills portrays the young girl and is excellent, as is the film.

THE BEST bet for the movies,

however, is at the Heilig. There, "Oceans 11" and "The Sundowners" are showing.

"Oceans" gives those interested viewers a good peek at the famous Hollywood Clan—it is also good entertainment. The film stars Frank Sinatra, Dean Martin, Sammy Davis, Jr., Peter Lawford, Angie Dickinson, and any other members in good standing.

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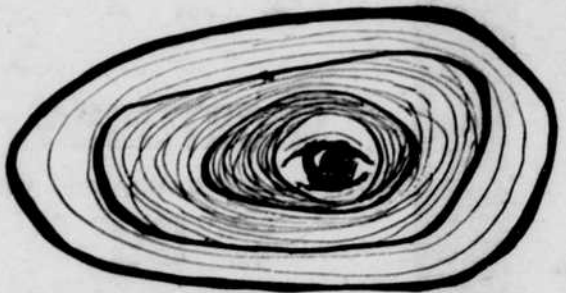
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
