

Ducklings meet Rooks in 'Little Civil War'

The Oregon Frosh will seek its third straight victory when the Ducklings tangle with the Oregon State Rooks in the "Little Civil War" at Corvallis on Thanksgiving morning. Game time is 10 a.m.

The Ducklings whitewashed the Rooks, 12-0, in their first meeting at Portland on a wet and cold Nov. 2 evening. Duckling halfback Cary Tommeraason scored the first six pointer in that game on a 28-yard run and Bob Burles intercepted a pass for the other touchdown.

The Rook offense is spearheaded by the passing of quarterback Gordon Queen from St. Mary's high school in Berkeley, Calif.

Queen had a bad evening against the Ducklings in the other encounter between the two teams, completing only two passes and having two intercepted by the alert Duck secondary.

Against Washington, Queen completed eight of eleven passes for 217 yards and threw three touchdown passes in the 46-8 Rook win.

He had another good afternoon against the Washington State Couababes, although the Rooks dropped the thriller, 22-20, connecting on 11 of 17 passes for 196 yards.

Queen's main targets are a pair of 6-4 ends, Scott Miller from Kelso and Doug McDougal of Portland's Wilson high.

The probable starting OSU

backfield, along with Queen, will consist of Dick DeFillippo at right half, Dan Espalin at left half, and Art O'Grady at fullback.

The Ducklings will be paced by the passing of quarterback Mike Brundage and the running of halfbacks Cary Tommeraason and Chuck Miller. Brundage has thrown three touchdown passes thus far this season.

Tommeraason leads the Ducklings in scoring, hitting paydirt four times for 24 points.

THE DUCKLINGS have a 2-0-1 record this season. Oregon opened the season by battling to a 14-14 tie with the Washington State Frosh. After dropping the Rooks, 12-0, the Frosh shut out the Washington Pups, 15-0.

Undefeated and untied Alabama has replaced Texas as the top team in the United Press International major college football ratings.

The Crimson Tide was named first in 25 ballots in voting by 35 leading coaches. Ohio State received seven first place votes, Minnesota two and Texas one.

Texas went from first to fifth after its 6-nothing upset at the hands of Texas Christian.

Here are this week's teams in order:

Alabama first, Ohio State second, Minnesota third, Louisiana State fourth, Texas fifth, Mississippi sixth and Michigan State seventh. Colorado is eighth, Michigan ninth and Arkansas 10th.

Utah State heads the second group.

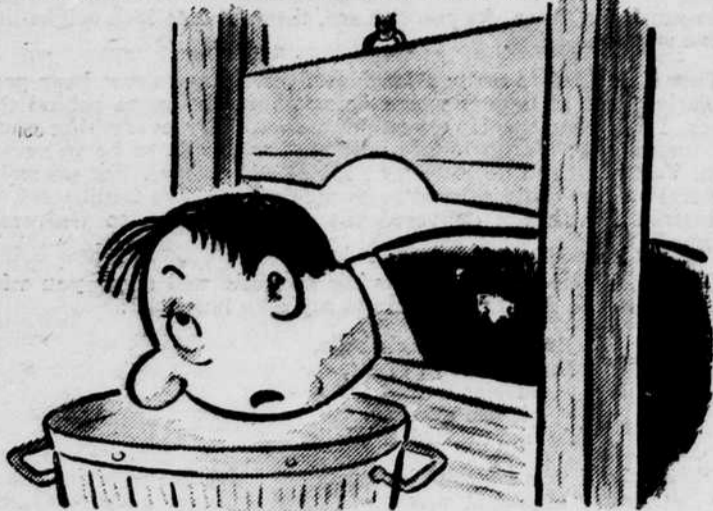
