Wood and a German economist have been named to a two-man educational evaluation and advisory team that will go under the auspices of UNESCO and the Economic Commission for the Far East.

Council Issues Hazing Rulings

Since Winter Term is the traditional time for fraternity initiation activities, the IFC President's Council has issued a reminder of the rules governing hazing at the University.

They are:

Fraternities will not plan, participate in, or allow activities which involve physical or mental abuse or which are in any way morally objectionable.

Fraternity activities will be planned so as to allow adequate time for class room participation and outside preparation. Fraternity pledges are expected to be physically prepared for active classroom participation.

Fraternity presidents and chapter advisors must be prepared to present signed statements to the Administration, if desired, assuring that these rules are being fully complied with.

The President's Council recommends charter suspension for any chapter which willfully disregards the above regulations.

Oregon Y.D.'s Get National Merit Award

A Young Democratic Clubs of Oregon has been selected as the outstanding Young Democratic state organization in the United States.

The announcement was made by Allen Howe, newly elected national Young Democrats president.

Howe said the Oregon organization was recognized for club activity, accomplishment, and harmony with the senior Democratic organization, as well as campaign activities during the 1960 presidential campaign.

Cited as outstanding were: a First Congressional District campaign caravan, formation of Watchdog Newspaper Clipping committees, letters-to-the-editor committee, establishment of the Oregon Young Democrat publications, selection of a legislative representative to represent YD's at the state capitol, and leadership conference, and chartering of 11 new clubs.

Faculty Club Remodeling Set

The Eugene architectural firm of Wilmsen, Endicott, and Uthank has been appointed to design the plans for the remodeling and expansion of the University's faculty club.

The Board of Higher Education authorized the appointment, and preliminary plans will be presented at an upcoming meeting.

The additional space will include 1,292 square feet in the basement and 260 square feet on the main floor.

J. Orville Lindstrom, University business manager, said cost of the remodeling was estimated at \$35,000. Rooms presently rented to faculty members will be converted to meeting rooms, and the downstairs area will be remodeled.

The money will come from the University's Cooperative Store Fund, according to Lindstrom.
