

# 'They Wore Us Down'—Belko

## Powerful OSU Sweeps Weekend Pair

"They're stronger physically and they simply wore us down." This was Oregon cage coach Steve Belko commenting on the Oregon State Beavers, the ball club which handed the Ducks two losses this weekend in a home and away series.

Belko didn't feel it necessary to make excuses for his Webfoots. "We played good ball, especially Saturday night, and the Beavers just simply overpowered us. I don't know where in the West there is a better ball club. Although I hate to admit it, I think Slat's Gill has one of the greatest teams in the country

this year—perhaps the best in Oregon State history."

**THE OREGON** coach singled out Oregon State's "High C's", seven-foot Mel Counts and 6-7 Jay Carty as the outstanding Beavers of the series. He felt Orange guard Steve Pauly deserved mention for his outstanding play Friday night, as did Terry Baker, but admitted that it was Carty who was most outstanding for the two games.

For Oregon, it was Charlie Warren who again drew praises from his coach. Along with Warren, Belko lauded Jerry Anderson. He pointed out that Anderson was exceptional both nights while Warren seemed to be bothered by a cold on Friday evening. Saturday evening "Chuckin' Charlie" dumped 32 counters, second best performance of his career.

### Friday Night

A near capacity crowd of over 10,000 filed into McArthur Court Friday night to watch the OSU cagers down the Ducks in the basketball version of the Oregon vs. Oregon State "Civil War."

The score, 79-63, indicates that Oregon was never in the ball game. The indications are correct—they never were.

**AFTER** two and a half minutes of the contest had slipped by, the Ducks were leading 5-2. Three minutes later the Orange-men led 12-5. With seven minutes left in the first half Oregon State led by 15, 32-17. From here on the OSU lead deviated only slightly until the final buzzer.

It was Jay Carty who led the point parade with 25 important counters while the two lightning fast OSU guards, Steve Pauly and Terry Baker, each hit for 15. Mel Counts was held to a mere 11 points, far below his 19.5 average, but nevertheless hauled in 18 rebounds. Counts and Carty pulled off 44 rebounds between them, only six less than the Ducks got as a team.

For the Ducks it was the sophomore substitute from Medford, Jerry Anderson, who dumped in 14 points to lead his teammates in scoring. Bill Simmons and Charlie Warren both hit for 11.

**AT THE** intermission rest, the staters led 49-28. The Webfoots had been able to grab off one out of every three rebounds. The home forces had shot an exasperating .250 (8-32) from the floor while the Beavers had been hitting at a solid .450 (19-44) clip.

When the second half began, it wasn't much different from the previous one, although the Beavers slacked off a little in their hitting from the field.

Beaver mentor Slat's Gill started emptying his bench until, with a little over 10 minutes left, the Ducks had come within 13 points, 63-50. Immediately Counts and Carty again entered the contest and put the Beavers ahead by twenty within three minutes. Again the OSU subs entered the game, this time to stay.

### Saturday Night

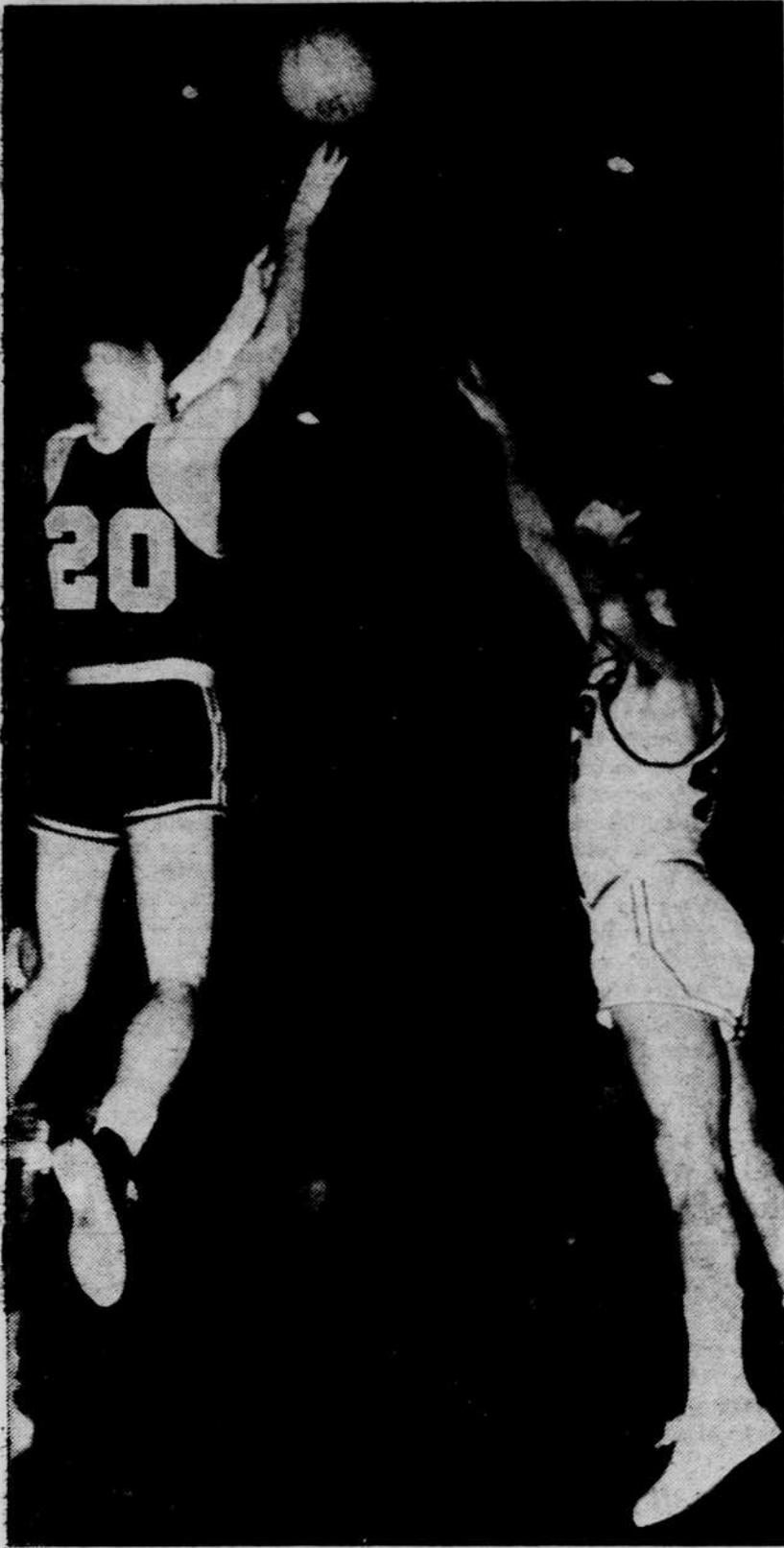
The OSU Beavers lengthened their win streak to 15, won back

the coveted Chancellor's Cup, and continued to clear the road to the NCAA regionals with a stunning 82-66 victory over the Oregon Ducks before a record crowd in Gill Coliseum Saturday night.

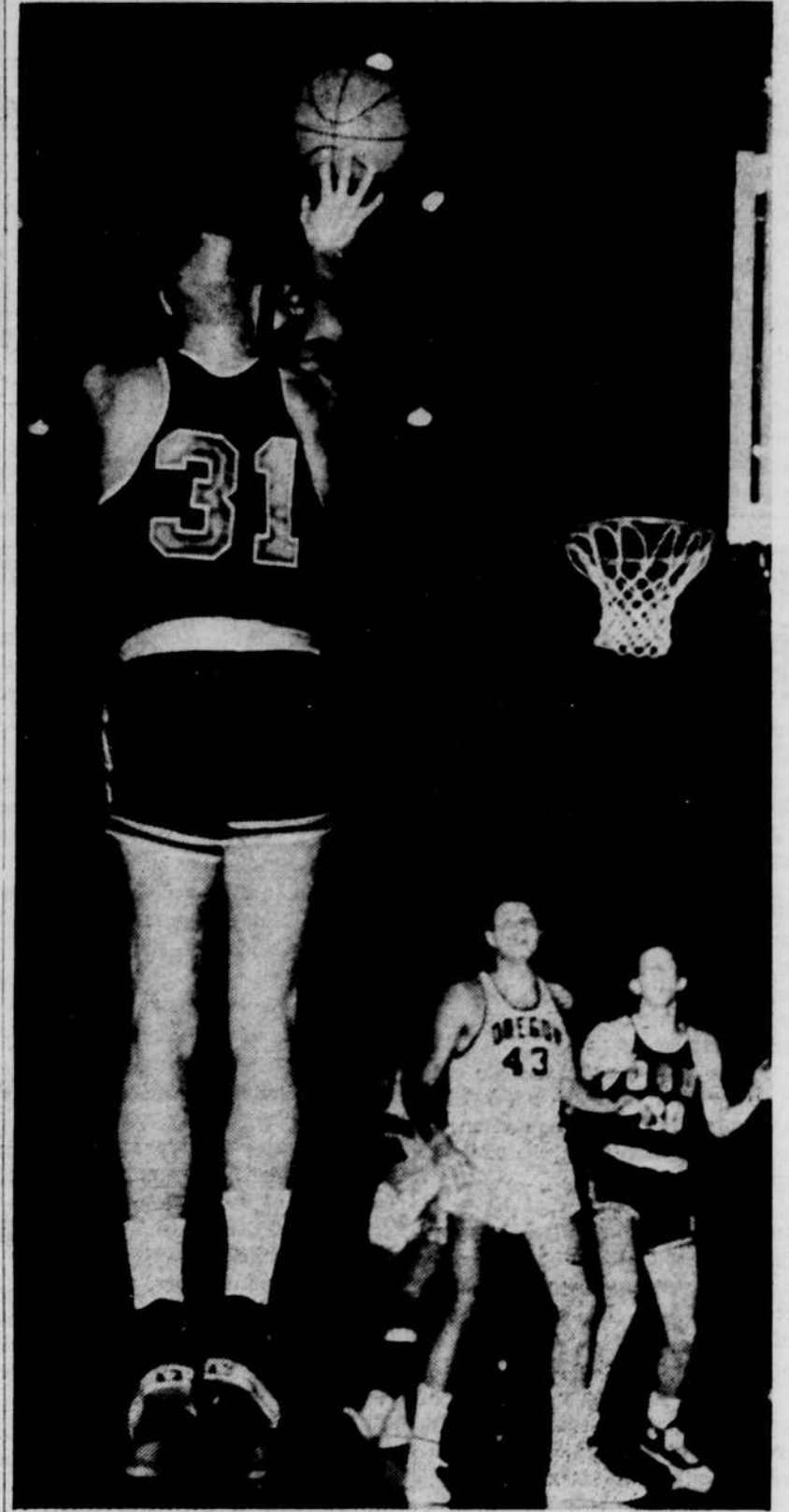
Unlike the night before, the Ducks managed to stay in the ball game until, with a little over

ten minutes to go in the contest and the score at 48-46, the Beavers put on one of the most dazzling displays of basketball art to be seen anywhere. The Ducks fell behind more and more, trailing by 20 points, 80-60, with just two minutes left. They

## Ducklings End Rooks' Unbeaten Skein

The Oregon Frosh ended the Oregon State Rooks' undefeated string at eight games Friday night with a 64-57 victory in the preliminary to the Duck-Beaver varsity encounter at McArthur Court.

But the Rooks of coach Jim Anderson got revenge on Saturday with a 70-57 win at Corvallis.

On Friday it was the visitors' Frank Peters leading all scorers with 20 points, followed by the Ducklings' Bo Blair with 15. Saturday evening Jim Jarvis of Oregon State got 20 tallies, Peters scored 16, and Oregon's Bob Yates led his teammates with 11.

The Rooks now hold a 2-1 edge in the series between the two teams and a 9-1 record for the season. Don Kirsch's Frosh are 6-5.
