

Webfoots Travel For WSU Series

Oregon's exciting Webfoots, led by the offensive ability of senior forward Charlie Warren, travel to Pullman this weekend to meet Washington State University in a two-game basketball series.

Warren, who emerged from last week's series with Idaho as the greatest point producer in Oregon cage history, is currently pacing the Ducks in scoring with an average of 22.6 points per game. That figure is good enough to place him among the top 40 scorers in the nation.

THE WEBFOOTS are fresh from a 91-64 trouncing of Idaho in what has to rank as their finest offensive effort of the season. Coach Steve Belko will undoubtedly stick with the same starting lineup that produced that victory.

In addition to Warren, that group includes senior Bill Simmons at forward, senior Wally Knecht at center, and sophomores Jerry Anderson and Steve Jones

at guards.

Oregon heads into the series, set for Friday and Saturday, with a pair of wins over the Cougars already on the record books this season. The Webfoots took the measure of Coach Marv Harshman's crew by 91-81 and 81-71 margins at Eugene earlier.

WSU DOASTS a pair of top-flight scorers in 6-2 senior guard Terry Ball and 6-6 senior forward Charlie Sells. Ball was particularly effective in the previous series, hitting for 44 points in the two games.

Other probable starters for the Cougars are Dwight Damon at forward, Neil Dirom at center, and Byron Vadset, the only sophomore in an otherwise all-senior lineup at guard.

The Webfoots carry a 9-11 season record into the series with WSU. The Ducks are 6-3 at home for the season, but on the road have been able to manage only three triumphs in 11 tries.

Rugby Team Hosts Vancouver Squad

The Oregon Rugby team opens its 1962 home season against a very strong British Columbia team Saturday afternoon on the varsity football practice field. Game time is 2:30.

The Webfoot ruggers will be looking for their first win of the year after dropping a pair of matches last week. Thursday the touring Oregonians met defeat at the hands of the more experienced Western Washington College club at Bellingham, and on Saturday they lost to the powerful University of British Columbia.

The Oregon squad will be led by team captain Alan Morton in the backfield, and Jerry Jones in the big front line.

Wrestlers Host Bears

Coach Mike Reuter sends his strong University of Oregon wrestling team against the University of California Friday at McArthur Court. The dual match will get underway at 7 p.m.

The Webfoots enter the match with an 8-1-1 season record. The only blots on the Oregon record are a loss to defending Pacific Coast Intercollegiate champion Oregon State and a tie with Portland State.

The Ducks follow up the California match by traveling to Corvallis Saturday for an invitational meet, to be conducted under Olympic rules, which includes Oregon State, Oregon State Rooks, Multnomah Athletic Club, and the Olympic Club of San Francisco.

The Oregon freshmen grapplers are also scheduled for action, venturing to Portland Friday afternoon for a match with the Portland freshmen.

Ducklings Slate Salem AAU Team

With the Oregon varsity on the road, the Webfoots' freshman basketball team takes over the local hoop spotlight this weekend by meeting Lindberg Distributors of Salem at McArthur Court Saturday. Tip-off time is 8 p.m.

It will be the second encounter between the two teams. The Ducklings notched a 72-64 decision over the Salem AAU outfit in the earlier meeting.

Top scorer for the Ducklings, who own a 7-6 season record, is 6-3 center Bo Blair with 123 points. Blair is followed by 5-10 guard Bob Yates, who has tallied 117 points, and 6-4 forward Larry Cooley with 105 counters.

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Swimmers Await OSU Meet Here Saturday

Oregon's powerful swimming team, the best in the Northwest, will attempt to keep its undefeated status intact Saturday in a dual meet against Oregon State at Leighton Pool. The meet will start at 2 p.m.

The Webfoot tankers clinched the mythical Northwest championship by sweeping past Washington State and Idaho this weekend.

The last time these two teams met, the Ducks walked away with an easy 68-27 victory, winning all but two events and setting six meet records.

In Saturday night's win over Idaho, Oregon won every event except the diving competition in which they had no entries. The final score of the meet was Oregon 67, Idaho 24.
