

## Oregon History Given In Applegate Papers

The University recently received the important Oliver C. Applegate papers given to the library by his son, Oliver C. Applegate of San Francisco, Calif.

Over 3,500 letters are in the collection, which represents one of the largest and most important sources of Oregon history from the 1840s to the 1930s.

The Applegates are one of Oregon's best-known pioneer families. The name Applegate is perpetuated in Oregon history and lore through the Applegate trail, a route Jesse and Lindsey Applegate, explored and followed on their journey into Oregon in the early 1840s.

**THE COLLECTION**, which begins with letters of Lindsey Applegate, Oliver's father, includes drafts of Indian treaties and other documents, diaries and other papers about the Modoc War of 1872-73, and letters to such well-known people as A.B. Meacham, Jeff Riddle, John F. Rose, and William C. McKay, besides many personal letters containing detailed information about the social and political life of the times. Most of the correspondence emanates for Salem, the Yoncalla area, and various points in southern Oregon.

In his later years, Oliver C. Applegate was a familiar figure at pioneer gatherings and events honoring the history of Oregon. His advice and counsel was sought by historians and writers.

Lewis McArthur wrote him for information on Oregon place names and his opinion on a variety of subjects related to history and geography. He was active in the American Pioneer Trails Association, and a friend to all those who were interested in preserving the memory of the pioneer.

The importance of the Applegate collection is commented on enthusiastically by Earl Pomeroy, Beekman professor of Northwestern Pacific history in the University and an authority on the history of the region. He remarked: "These papers are unsurpassed as a source on the social history of Oregon. They pertain both to the public careers of members of one of the first families of the state and to details of everyday life over nearly a century that usually do not appear in public records, political manuscripts, and most published histories. The people of southern Oregon have been unusually careful in preserving historical materials. By drawing on the papers of Oliver C. Applegate and on related materials already in the University Library, our graduate students will have rich opportunities to study and write the history of the state and region in wide perspective."

Research students have already consulted the file for a variety of subjects. Historians will continue to reply on the contemporary documents that make up the

## School to Hold Health Seminar

A health science seminar will be offered during the 1962 summer sessions by the School of Health, Physical Education and Recreation.

**TOPICS OF THE program** will include Civil Defense, cost of medical education and care, environment health, heart disease, cancer, mental health, accident prevention, alcoholism, exercise, and the modern hospital. A tour of Sacred Heart Hospital will be included.

Franklin B. Haar, Ph.D., professor of health education, and Emil Furrer, M.D., associate professor of health education, are coordinators of the seminar.

Drs. Haar and Furrer will be aided by lecturers from the State Board of Health and Civil Defense, Department of Motor Vehicles, Alcohol Education Commission, Oregon State Medical Society, University of Oregon Medical School and Sacred Heart Hospital staff.

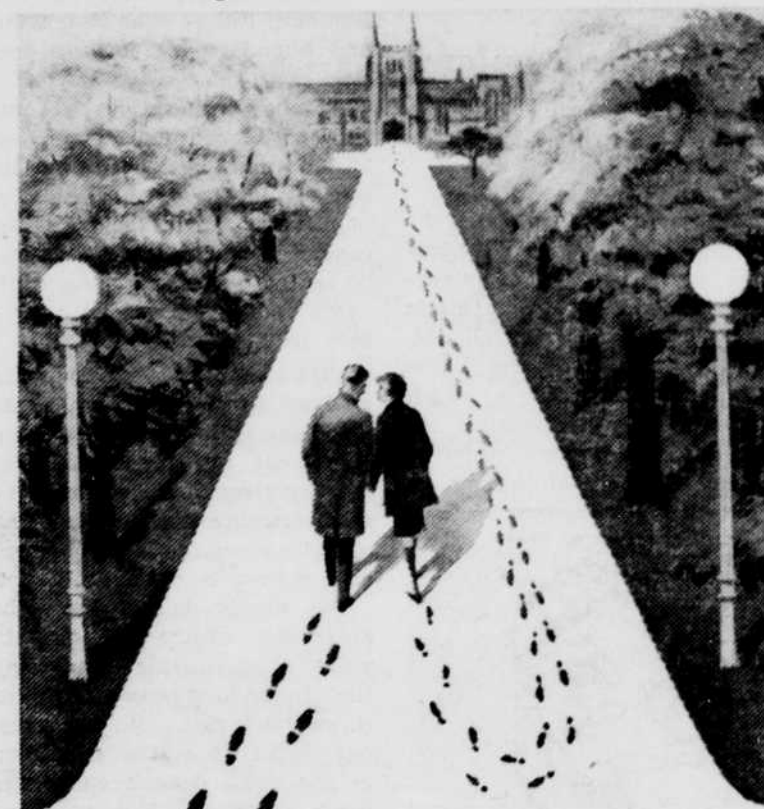
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
