



William R. McGraw directs William Inge's celebrated drama of unholy wedlock, shattered dreams, and acute alcoholism. Inge revamped a short story about a Scottie Puppy into the tale of an alcoholic small town chiropracter who is married to an "indolent slattern," and who nourishes the illusion that their young

boarder is like his wife was when they first married. The drama became a sensation on Broadway, and a favorite of thousands of movie-goers. After this smash, Inge produced his Pulitzer Prize-winning "Picnic," and then "Bus-Stop" and "The Dark at the Top of the Stairs." Starring Lowell Slick, Cheryle Hendrickson, and Jacqueline McClure, "Come Back Little Sheba" also features H. Lawrence Ferguson, Dean Kennedy, Meredith Payne, William Gwinn, James Norton, Howard Silberstein, Brad Hollinger, and Clark Santee.
