

### Gridders Leave; Opener Nears

Oregon's football Ducks left the Eugene airport Thursday morning for a six-hour flight to Austin, Texas and the Saturday evening grid battle with the mighty University of Texas Longhorns.

The Ducks left two warriors behind, center Ron Stratten and veteran quarterback Doug Post. Stratten was injured in Spring practice and Post sustained an injury in pre-season scrimmage when he dived for a fumble.

WITH POST out it will be Bob Berry, a sophomore, getting the starting nod at QB. Other backfield starters will be Mel Renfro and left half, Larry Hill at right half, and Jim Josephson at fullback.

Starting in the line at ends will be Dick Imwalle and Greg Willener. At tackles will be Steve Barnett and Ron Snidow; in the guard slots will be Ed Thomas and Mickey Ordning; and at center will be Rick Dixon.

All but Berry are lettermen and only Berry, Imwalle, Thomas and Hill were regulars on last year's squad.

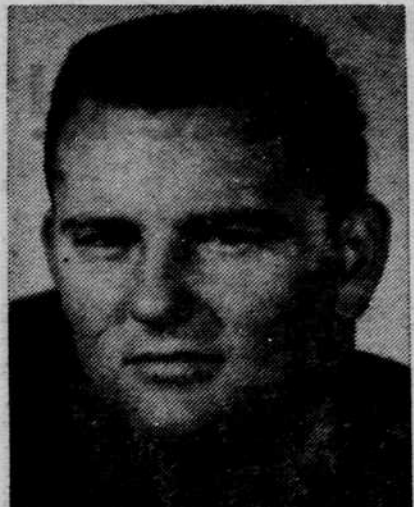
THE DUCKS took a brief workout in Austin Thursday evening to get their first test of grid battle under the lights and will have another drill Friday night in preparation for the rugged season opener.

Coach Len Casanova, when speaking of the coming battle, related that the Ducks were facing double jeopardy. "First we have to consider Texas's power and speed on the field. Then we have to think of the weather."

The weather in Texas has been very warm and it is thought that it may have some effect on the Ducks, who are not used to unusually warm temperatures.

The game is scheduled for 7:30 in Texas, 5:30 Eugene time.

# Tankers Conference Favorites

The University of Oregon swim team is favored to finish first in the Far West Conference, Coach Don Van Rossen said in an interview Thursday. The conference is composed of Washington, Washington State, University of Idaho, Oregon State and Oregon.

The team, which won eight of nine dual meets before losing to University of Washington, in the championships, is an experienced one. The squad, with the exception of seven lettermen, will be returning.

The lettermen will be adequately replaced by members of last year's Freshman squad. "Last season's Frosh team was the strong-

est one in the University's history," Van Rossen said. "In seven meets they lost only once, and that was to the Varsity."

One of the standouts on the Frosh team last year was Dick Boyd. Boyd holds five University of Oregon Frosh records and is co-holder of another. He was leading scorer on the Frosh squad, and Coach Van Rossen hopes he will be one of the top scorers for the Varsity this year.

The team will also be strengthened by transfer students Bob Benson and Tony Hitchcock of Foothill Junior College; Larry Oshiro, Shasta J.C., and Donn Daly from San Mateo Junior Col-

lege. Last season Benson was rated the No. 1 Junior College swimmer in the country. He was All-American in the 220 yard and 440 yard free style events. He also set the national Junior College record in the 440 yard with a time of 3:57.3.

Two of the top swimmers re-

turning this season are senior Dave Boye and junior John Tompkins.

Boye men set a new 50 yard freestyle record for the University swimmers of 22.9 seconds. The time surpassed the oldest remaining record at the University. Jim Hurd set the old time of 23 seconds flat in 1937.

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
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## Cashing Checks at The Student Union

As a service, the Student Union has always cashed checks at the Main Desk for students and faculty. With the increase in enrollment the number of checks cashed has increased, also the number of NSF and other bad checks. However, the greatest increase has been in the percentage of bad checks.

This year a service charge of \$1.00 is charged on any returned checks, and anyone writing a second bad check will be relieved of their privilege of cashing any other checks at the Student Union, for the balance of the school year.

Occasionally, the main desk will be unable to cash any checks. The average is about \$125.00 per hour and unexpectedly heavy runs can seriously deplete the supply of cash on hand.

If you err, and your check is returned, you will be notified at once. It is then your responsibility to take care of your check as soon as possible. And DO WATCH IT, for two offenses, and your privilege of cashing checks at the Union is taken away. This will be of disadvantage to you only.

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
