

"Civil Liberties" Theme Of October Celebration

Jamés Madison Nabrit, Jr., president of Howard University, Washington, D.C., will be the convocation speaker at the annual Charter Day celebration on October 16.

THE 1962 Charter Day will have the theme of "Civil Liberties" in honor of the one hundredth anniversary of the Emancipation Proclamation. This is the first time a theme has been used. "We will undoubtedly continue this policy," Flemming said. He said further that in the future Charter Day speakers will be chosen with the theme in mind.

Nabrit, an educator and administrator of note, has long been a leader in the work for civil rights and anti-segregation. His address on Charter Day will be on aspects of civil rights. Howard University, although it has a large proportion of white students, is well known for its attempts to insure that colored people have a maximum opportunity to benefit from higher education.

A graduate of Morehouse College in Atlanta, Ga., Nabrit received his doctor of jurisprudence degree from Northwestern University. He has since received honorary doctorates from Morehouse College and Lincoln University.

HE HAS BEEN on the faculty of Howard University since 1936, teaching in the School of Law and serving in administrative offices. He has been administrative assistant to the president, director of public relations, secretary to the university, dean of the School of Law, and, since 1961, president of the university.

In 1959 and 1960, he was advisor to the U. S. delegation to the International Labor Organization in Geneva. He is legal advisor to the reorganization of the executive branch of the government of the Virgin Islands, and a member of the board of trustees of Howard University.

The educator holds membership in the American, National, and Texas Bar Associations, the American Juridical Society, the National Society for Medical Research, and the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

HE HAS contributed numerous articles to professional journals. The Charter Day convocation will be at 10:00 a.m., October 16, in McArthur Court.
