

Faculty Concert Scheduled Tonight

A faculty program of American instrumental solo and chamber music from the middle 20th century will be presented today.

The program, a feature of the four-day annual Symposium on Contemporary Band and Wind Instrument Music sponsored by the University School of Music, will be in the auditorium of the Music School at 8 p.m. It is open to the public.

Opening the concert will be "Four Scenes for Piano" by Lawrence Moss, with William Woods, assistant professor of music, performing.

PAUL EARLS' "Colloquy for Chamber Ensemble" will be played by Karlin Rhees, flute; Robert Cunningham, oboe; Robert Wagner, clarinet; Vondis Miller, trumpet; and Robert Hladky, cello. Earls is a new member of the Music School faculty.

Homer Keller at the piano and a percussion trio of Wayne Mercer, Jerry Green, and Dan Nelson will perform John Cage's "Amores for prepared piano and percussion."

Keller's composition, "Quartet for Brass Instruments," will be performed by Alan Nyegaard and Vondis Miller, trumpets, and Ira Lee, trombone, and Scott Philips, horn.

JOHN HAMILTON will present Lou Harrison's "Three Sonatas for Harpsichord."

Concluding number of the program will be Leon Kirchner's "Trio in Two Movements." This will be performed by Lawrence

Maves, violin, Robert Hladky, cello, and William Woods, piano. They are members of the University Trio.

Graduate Students Given Fellowships

Two fellowships to University graduate students have been renewed for the second year by the U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare.

The \$2,500 fellowships have been received by Stanley E. Brown, a candidate for a doctoral degree in education, and Ralph F. Leeder, who is doing post-master's degree work. Both are studying in the field of mental retardation.

THE HEW fellowships were established to stimulate advanced education for administrators of special education programs for the mentally retarded in the public schools.

Each fellowship is awarded to the state department of education of the recipient's home state and then passed on to the educational institution of the student's choice. The present fellowships came to the University through the Oregon and Nebraska departments of education.

Sophomore Honorary Adds to Membership

Local Colleges Gain Enrollment

Oregon's community college system, including vocational-technical schools, currently has a 38 per cent enrollment increase over last year.

The State Department of Education released figures indicating a total fall enrollment of 9,842. This is 2,705 over enrollment last fall.

There are 6,832 students in the category combining vocational extension (evening) classes and general education. The college transfer category accounts for 945 students, and vocational-technical 2,065.

These figures are based on the enrollments of nine institutions

classified as community colleges or vocational-technical schools. The schools include: Eugene Technical-Vocational; Blue Mountain Community College, Pendleton; Central Oregon College, Bend; and Clatsop County Community College, Astoria.

Oregon City Vocational-Technical School; Portland Community College; Salem Technical-Vocational School; Southwestern Oregon Community College, North Bend and Coos Bay; and Treasure Valley Community College, Ontario, complete the list.

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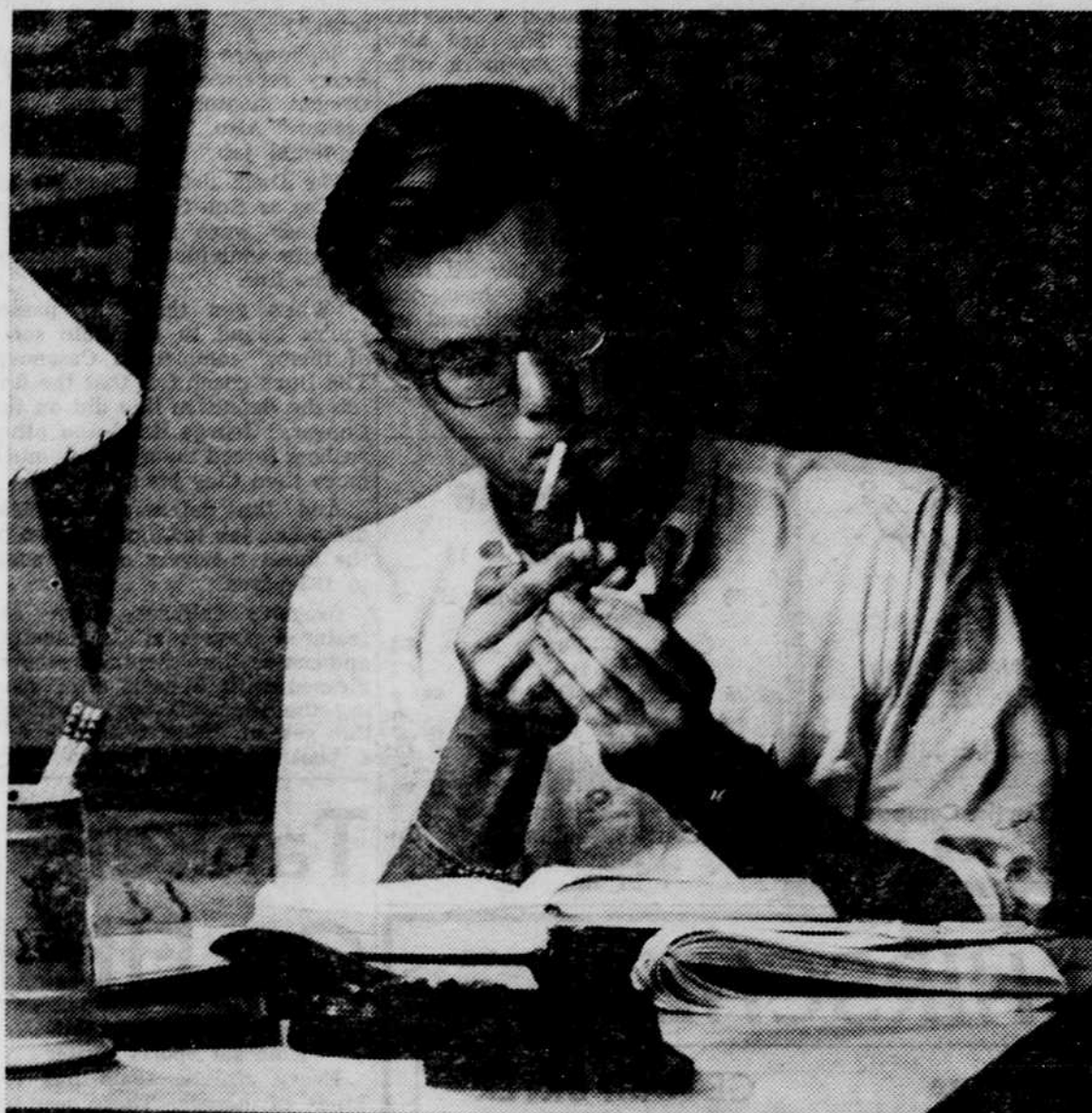
