Council Updates
Constitution, Rush

Constitutional up-dating and revision, including the raising of requirements for rush, were passed by the Inter-Fraternity Council presidents' council Wednesday night.

DAN O'CONNELL, head of the Presidents' Council, said Thursday the last constitutional revision was made when there was no difference between the Presidents' Council and the IFC. Under the new revision the constitution expands to include both, and an executive council will serve as a liaison committee between them.

Rush requirements were raised to a five-stanine rating for freshmen and a 2.25 accumulative GPA for transfers. Previous requirements were four for freshmen and 2.0 for transfers.

All policies previously passed but not actually incorporated into the constitution, such as the policy toward hazing, have now been included.

OTHER CHANGES, said O'Connell, were of a minor nature and were simply efforts to update the constitution.
