Speaks Today

Donald H. Tilson, manager of Northwest operations for the Aluminum Company of America, will speak this afternoon in the first of a series of lectures for the Business Policies class.

TILSON will speak at 2 p.m. in 238 Commonwealth and then attend a coffee hour in the Student Union. The reception will be open to all business administration graduate students and faculty.

Tilson, who joined Alcoa in 1920, was named manager of Northwest operations in 1956. He is active in civic and national affairs and is presently a director of the Association of Washington Industries, chairman of the Advisory Board of the Washington State Institute of Technology and a member of the advisory council to the Washington State Department of Commerce and Economic Development.

HE IS A member of the visiting committee of the University of Washington College of Engineering and serves on the advisory committee of the Seattle-First National Bank in Vancouver, national counselor of the Vancouver Chamber of Commerce and West Coast Director of the Purdue University Alumni Association.
